

**RESTATEMENT OF ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION OF  
CALVARY COMMUNITY CHURCH OF SARASOTA, INC.**

We, the undersigned, acknowledge and file in the Office of the Secretary of State of Florida for the purpose of restating the Articles of Incorporation with amendments as by law provided of Calvary Community Church of Sarasota, Inc. a Florida not for profit corporation.

**ARTICLE 1 - NAME**

The name of the Corporation shall be CALVARY COMMUNITY CHURCH OF SARASOTA, INC. The registered office shall be 6461 Proctor Road, Sarasota, Florida and the registered agent of the Corporation at such address is Robert Scott Young.

**ARTICLE 2 - PURPOSES**

The purposes for which the Corporation is formed are as follows:

- A. To disseminate the Gospel of Jesus Christ and the Word of God, to the end that people may be evangelized and believers may be conformed to the image of Jesus Christ;
- B. To regularly assemble together the members of this Corporation for fellowship one with another both in large public congregations and in small fellowship groups in houses and other places, to worship God in Spirit and in truth and to cooperate in the building up of the whole body of Christ;
- C. To provide basic New Testament discipleship to all who are approved for this purpose by the Elders;
- D. To involve every participant of this Corporation in its fellowship and activities and in the ministry of the Holy Spirit throughout the Body of Christ;
- E. To strengthen the family units so that the home life of each member is healthy and fruitful by Biblical standards;
- F. To perform the Sacraments of the Church which include, but are not limited to, the following: to baptize believers in water; to anoint the sick with oil; to conduct weddings and funerals; to dedicate infants; and to celebrate the Lord's Supper (communion);
- G. To act with charitable concern for all people in need of any help which this Church can give, regardless of race, social position, or religious affiliation; to develop and carry out programs of social action for poor, widowed, orphaned, afflicted, imprisoned, underprivileged, or aged persons, both within and without this Church;
- H. To pray for the needs of all people, for local and national leaders and governments and for all that are in authority as instructed in I Timothy 2:1-3;
- I. To support and encourage communication and extension of the Christian life and witness by sound and comprehensive preaching and teaching of Biblical principles to all people, both within this Church and elsewhere, not only by conventional modes, but also by all means which will accomplish such communication, extension, teaching and preaching. This should include media of communication developed by modern technology. These purposes should include to sponsor, participate in, conduct or engage in radio broadcasting, television broadcasting, the printing or reproduction and publication of recordings, books and other materials, the establishment and operation of a school or schools, and the holding and conduction of seminars, study groups, work shops, and meetings by either resident or traveling ministers; to receive offerings for such purposes; and to grant aid and pay reasonable compensation to persons, firms and corporations for services actually rendered for such purposes; provided, however, that none of the foregoing shall be done for private profit;
- J. To establish and maintain a place(s) of worship, study, recreation and social interaction, ministering to the whole family and the whole person, spirit, soul, and body;
- K. To recognize, support and cooperate with the various ministries established by God to equip believers to fulfill their respective functions as members of the Body of Christ and to bring the whole Body of Christ to unity, maturity and completion;

- L. To license and ordain ministers; to assist in the establishment and maintenance of other churches, or other institutions, and to send forth and maintain ministers, missionaries or other workers for the establishment and up-building of such churches, or institutions, either domestic or foreign;
- M. To provide and maintain homes, places and buildings for housing of such students, lecturers, teachers and ministers, as well as other related agents of the Church; to furnish to such students, lecturers, teachers, educators and ministers suitable meals and lodging;
- N. To acquire, either by deed, gift or purchase, any real estate or personal property to be held in trust for the benefit of the Corporation and its stated purposes;
- O. To mortgage, sell, or otherwise encumber any such property when such action is deemed to be in the best interests of the Church as defined in its stated purpose as a Christian organization;
- P. To operate a church organization exclusively for charitable, religious, and educational purposes within the meaning of Section 501 (c) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code (or the corresponding provision of any future United States Revenue Law), including, but not limited to, for such purposes, the establishing and maintaining of religious worship, the building , maintaining and operating of churches, parsonages, school, chapels, radio stations, television stations, rescue missions, print shops, day-care centers, camps, and nursing homes;
- Q. To ordain and license persons to the Gospel ministry; evangelize the unsaved by proclaiming of the Gospel of the Lord Jesus Christ; educate believers in a manner consistent with the requirements of Holy Scripture, both in Sunday and weekday schools of Christian education; and maintain missionary activities in the United States and any foreign country; and,
- R. To accomplish the foregoing purposes, the corporation shall have all corporate powers permitted under Florida law, including the capacity to contract, bring suit and be sued. No part of the income of the Church shall be distributed to the members or directors, provide that nothing herein contained shall be construed to preclude any director from serving the organization as an officer or in any other capacity and receiving compensation therefore of the Corporation;

The property of this corporation is irrevocably dedicated to religious purposes and no part of the net income or assets of this corporation shall ever inure to the benefit of, or be distributed to its, members, trustees, directors, officers, or other private persons, except that this corporation shall be authorized and empowered to pay reasonable compensation for services rendered and to make payments and distributions in furtherance of the purposes set forth in Article Two (2) hereof. Upon the dissolution of this corporation, its assets shall be distributed for one or more exempt purposes within the meaning of section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, or corresponding section of any future federal tax code, or shall be distributed to the federal government, or to a state or local government, for a public purpose.

Notwithstanding any other provision of these articles, this corporation shall not carry on any other activities not permitted to be carried on (a) by an organisation exempt from federal income tax under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, or corresponding sections of any future federal tax code, or (b) by an organisation, contributions to which are deductible under section 170(c)(2) of the Internal Revenue Code, or corresponding section of any future federal tax code.

#### ARTICLE 3 – MEMBERSHIP

Membership shall be determined as provided in the Bylaws.

#### ARTICLE 4 – PERIOD OF DURATION

The Corporation shall have a perpetual existence.

#### ARTICLE 5 – DIRECTORS

The affairs of this corporation shall be managed by a Board of Directors with the Pastor as president by virtue of his office. The vice-president and secretary are designated in accordance with the Bylaws. These three officers shall be the directors of the corporation, along with such other

officers and directors as shall be provided in the Bylaws. Power and authority to act for this corporation in all matters is vested in the Board of Directors also called the Church Council. Power and authority to constitute and convene the Board of Directors with the Trustees, or the Elders, or the Trustees and Elders together is vested in the Pastor. Directors shall be determined as provided in the Bylaws.

ARTICLE 6 – OFFICERS

Officers shall be determined as provided in the Bylaws.

ARTICLE 7 – DEFINITIONS

Definitions found in the Bylaws also apply herein these Articles.


ARTICLE 8 – AMENDMENTS



These Articles of Incorporation replace all other Articles of Incorporation.


