CERTIFICATE OF REDOMESTICATION THE TRAVELERS INDEMNITY COMPANY OF AMERICA

THE TRAVELERS INDEMNITY COMPANY OF AMERICA (the "Company"), a Georgia corporation, in order to change its domicile to Connecticut as permitted pursuant to section 38a-58a of the General Statutes of Connecticut, certifies as follows:

- 1. The name of the Company is The Travelers Indemnity Company of America.
- 2. The Company was incorporated under the name <u>Standard National Insurance Company</u> in the State of Georgia on January 2, 1946, where it has remained to this date. The Company changed its name to The Travelers Indemnity Company of America on November 1, 1971. Except pursuant to this certificate, the Company has not attempted to change its domicile.
- 3. By letter dated May 12, 1997, the Insurance Department of the State of Georgia has approved the Company request for a change in domicile to Connecticut in accordance with the laws of Georgia and the State of Connecticut. By letter dated June 30, 1997, the Insurance Department of the State of Connecticut approved the Company's application to redomesticate to Connecticut effective June 30, 1997.
- 4. The Company's plan to redomesticate has been approved by the Company's Board of Directors and its sole shareholder pursuant to section 33-797 of The General Statutes of Connecticut.

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AMENDED AND RESTATED CERTIFICATE OF INCORPORATION OF THE TRAVELERS INDEMNITY COMPANY OF AMERICA

Section 1. The name of the corporation is The Travelers Indemnity Company of America.

Section 2. The business to be carried on by the Company is the issuance of insurance, reinsurance and excess insurance policies covering all kinds of casualty, life, accident and health and fire insurance risks including:

- (1) Accident and health insurance
- (2) Fire insurance
- (3) Miscellaneous property insurance
- (4) Water damage insurance
- (5) Burglary and theft insurance
- (6) Glass insurance
- (7) Boiler and machinery
- (8) Elevator insurance
- (9) Animal insurance
- (10) Collision insurance
- (11) Personal injury liability insurance
- (12) Property damage insurance
- (13) Workmen's compensation and employer's liability insurance
- (14) Fidelity and surety insurance
- (15) Credit insurance
- (16) Title insurance
- (17) Motor vehicle and aircraft insurance
- (18) Marine insurance
- (19) Marine protection and indemnity insurance
- (20) Inland marine insurance
- (21) Life insurance

The above enumeration shall not exclude any other risk or class or classes whatsoever of casualty, fire and life insurance which now or hereafter may be permitted to be written by insurance companies under the laws of the State of Connecticut.

Section 3. The amount of capital stock shall be Five Million Two Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$5,250,000), said stock to consist of One Hundred Seventy-Five Thousand (175,000) shares of common stock of the par value of Thirty (\$30) Dollars per share. The corporation desires the right as a corporation from the time to time to increase its capital stock to such an amount as may be desired by the stockholders, as well as from time to time decrease the same to the minimum provided by law - all in the manner and upon the terms authorized by law.

Section 4. The personal liability to the corporation or its shareholders of a person who is or was a director of the corporation for monetary damages for breach of duty as a director shall be limited to the amount of the compensation received by the director for serving the corporation during the year of the violation if such breach did not (a) involve a knowing and culpable violation of law by the director, (b) enable the director or an associate, as defined in Section 33-840(2) of the Connecticut Business Corporation Act as in effect on the effective date hereof or as it may be amended from time to time, to receive an improper personal gain, (c) show a lack of good faith and a conscious disregard for the duty of the director to the corporation under circumstances in which the director was aware that his conduct or omission created an unjustifiable risk of serious injury to the corporation, (d) constitute a sustained and unexcused pattern of inattention that amounted to an abdication of the director's duty to the corporation, or (e) create liability under Section 33-757 of the Connecticut Business Corporation Act as in effect on the effective date hereof or as it may be amended from time to time. This Section 4 shall not limit or preclude the liability of a person who is or was a director for any act or omission occurring prior to the effective date hereof on the date of filing of a Certificate of Amendment amending the Charter of the corporation with the Secretary of the State of the State of Connecticut. The personal liability of a person who is or was a director to the corporation or its shareholders for breach of duty as a director shall further be limited to the full extent allowed by the Connecticut Business Corporation Act as it may be amended from time to time. Any lawful repeal or modification of this Section 4 or the adoption of any provision inconsistent herewith by the Board of Directors and the shareholders of the corporation shall not, with respect to a person who is or was a director, adversely affect any limitation of liability, right or protection existing at or prior to the effective date of such repeal, modification or adoption of a provision inconsistent herewith.

Section 5. The initial registered office of the Company shall be located at One Tower Square, Hartford, Connecticut. The initial registered agent, who shall be located at the registered office of the Company, shall be James M. Michener, Corporate Secretary.
