

We, the undersigned, hereby associate ourselves together for the purpose of forming a non-profit corporation under the laws of the State of Florida, and certify as follows:

#### ARTICLE I <u>NAME</u>

#### ARTICLE IV PURPOSE

The corporation is a non-profit corporation formed for the purpose of engaging in activities within or without the State of Florida or the United States, as follows:

- 1. To own, manage and operate properties at 600 N. Congress Ave. #560 Delray Beach, Fl. 33445.
- 2. The purpose for which Museum of Lifestyle & Fashion Inc. is organized are exclusively religious, charitable, scientific, literary, and educational within the meaning of section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 or the corresponding provision of any future United States Internal Revenue law.

#### ARTICLE V

In furtherance of the foregoing purposes of this corporation, the corporation shall have the following rights and privileges:

To borrow or raise money for any of the purposes of the corporation, and from time to time, without limit as to amount, to draw, make accept, endorse execute and issue promissory notes, drafts, bills of exchange, warrants, bonds, debentures and other negotiable or non-negotiable instruments and evidences of indebtedness, and to secur the payment of any thereof and of the interest thereon by mortgage or deed of trust upon pledge, conveyance or assignment in trust, of the whole or any part of the property of the corporation, whether at that time owned or thereafter acquired; and to sell, pledge or otherwise dispose of such bonds or other obligations of the corporation for its corporate purposes.
- 3. The corporation shall be authorized to exercise and enjoy all of the other powers, rights an privileges granted to or conferred upon corporations as set forth in the Statutes of the State of Florida.
- 4. Notwithstanding any other provisions herein to the contrary, this corporation shall not carry on any other activities not permitted to be carried on by a corporation exempt from federal income tax laws under Section 501(c) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended and the Treasury Regulations thereunder as the same now exists, or they may be hereafter amended from time to time, or by a corporation to which contributions are deductible under Section 170(c)(2) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended and the Treasury Regulations thereunder as the same now exists, or they may be hereafter

from federal income tax laws under Section 501(c) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended and the Treasury Regulations thereunder as the same now exists, or they may be hereafter amended from time to time, or by a corporation to which contributions are deductible under Section 170(c)(2) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended and the Treasury Regulations thereunder as the same now exists, or they may be hereafter amended from time to time.
