Merger Plan Agreement between the The Lee County School Readiness Coalition, Inc. The Hendry/Glades School Readiness Coalition, Inc. The Collier School Readiness Coalition, Inc.

This document outlines the Merger Plan Agreement between The Lee County School Readiness Coalition, Inc., the Hendry/Glades County School Readiness Coalition, Inc. and the Collier School Readiness Coalition, Inc. A Notice of Intent to Merge, dated September 20th, 2004, has been filed with the Office of Early Learning as required. The three coalitions agree to form the multicounty coalition with mutual respect for each other and commitment to the mission of each Coalition.

1. Name of the multi-county Coalition

The name of the multi-county Coalition is The Early Learning Coalition of Southwest Florida, Inc. The FEID to be used for the multi-county Coalition will be Lee County School Readiness Coalition's FEID #65-1144775.

2. Mission Statement

The new mission statement of the The Early Learning Coalition of Southwest Florida is:

The Early Learning Coalition of Southwest Florida will work in collaboration with our communities to develop successful learners and to support those in school for continued success.

3. Vision and Beliefs Statement

The new vision statement of the Coalition is:

All children in Collier, Glades, Hendry and Lee communities will be healthy, eager, and successful learners, supported by well-informed parents, involved citizens, and collaborative community partners. Early Learning Programs will have high quality standards, comprehensive services, seamless delivery system with diverse settings, and well-educated, competent, and adequately compensated staff.

We believe that:

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- Careful and thoughtful planning is necessary so that we do no harm, rush to change too quickly or change simply for the sake of change.
- A quality early care and education system is flexible and adaptable, providing comprehensive services for all children and families that need them.
- 3. Collaboration among all providers of early care and education ensures that the system is made up of the best and highest quality services that each has to offer children and families.
- 4. A quality early care and education system includes elementary schools and ensures they are ready to serve the children they receive.
- A quality early care and education system is well funded so that all the services necessary for every child to be ready for school can be provided.
- 6. A quality early care and education system recognizes and rewards those who provide quality services.
- 7. Diversity within and among children and staff enriches the experiences of all.
- 8. All children should have the benefit of a high quality early care and education program regardless of income or how they are served.
- 9. Families are their child's first and foremost teacher. Thus, a quality early care and education program includes services for families as well as children.
- 10. A stable, well-trained, and adequately compensated staff is a vital component of a quality early care and education system.
- 11. The community, including businesses, families and staff, must be educated so that they are fully aware of, and support, quality early care and education.
- 12. Children who are ready for school are healthy, well-nourished, excited, curious, eager to discover, responsive, bright-eyed, reflective, quizzical, imaginative, happy, earnest learners.

4. Geographic Location

The geographic location for the Coalition will contain all of Lee, Hendry, Glades, and Collier counties.

Projected minimum number of children to be served

For Fiscal Year 2004-05, the budgeted direct child care allocation must not be less than what was expended in the FY 2003-04 for direct child care per county. Each county will have the authority to decide the percentage of the budget to be spent on direct child care, not less than what was expended in the previous year. The projected number of children to be served will be calculated by the Florida Partnership's formula as provided in the Grant Award to the Coalition.

5. Federal, state or local laws or regulations

The Coalition will continue to comply with all applicable current federal, state and local laws or regulations.

6. Board membership structure

The multi-county Coalition membership will be comprised of one-third representation from each county for the eighteen appointed positions and rotated membership for the five designated positions. (See attached DRAFT Term of Office by County).

7. Multi-County Coalition Plan and Operational Delivery System

The multi-county Coalition Plan will be submitted to the Florida Partnership for School Readiness 60 working days after the effective date of the Articles of Merger. Until receipt of the final approval, each Coalition's current plan will be in effect. The administrative services are already shared and will continue with business as usual.

The newly-appointed Board members will establish a strategic and organizational plan, and bylaws to address the following issues:

- decision making process
- · service delivery structure
- organization chart
- · committee structure, duties and responsibilities
- core business activities to be performed by Coalition and/or competitively procured

8. Corporate Structure

The Early Learning Coalition of Southwest Florida Articles of Incorporation will be amended to show the joining of Lee, Collier and Hendry/Glades into one multi-county Coalition. Accordingly, the Lee County Coalition's FEID number, #65-1144775, will be utilized for the multi-county Coalition.

9. Merger Termination

Corporate reorganization may be achieved in the event of a Merger termination by creating a six-month timeline, with a written letter of termination that will highlight the responsibilities of each county.

10. Cost Allocation

The multi-county Coalition's funding, with specific programmatic expenditures determined by each Coalition, will be combined into one budget with expenses allocated to specific line items. The new cost allocation plan will be submitted to the Florida Partnership for School Readiness for approval no later than 60 working days after the effective date of the Articles of Merger. Until receipt of the final approval, each Coalition's current plan will be in effect.

It is the intent of The Lee County School Readiness Coalition, Hendry/Glades County School Readiness Coalition and the Collier School Readiness Coalition to be joined into a multi-county coalition no later than December 31st, 2004. (See Attached Transition Timeline for details).
