### A NOT FOR PROFIT CORPORATION

The undersigned incorporator for the purpose of forming a corporation under the Florida Not for Profit Corporation Act, hereby adopt(s) the following Articles of Incorporation:

#### ARTICLE I - Name:

The name of the Not for Profit Corporation shall be:

#### ARTICLE II - Principal Office:

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#### ARTICLE III - Purpose:

- (a) The Corporation is organized and shall be operated exclusively for charitable and educational purposes within the meaning of Sec. 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code and its Regulations as they now exist or as they may be hereafter amended, and it is authorized to receive and maintain funds, to have, hold, manage and sell the same, to change the investments thereof, to and reinvest the proceeds thereof, and to collect and receive the income and profits thereof; and to apply the income and principal to the aid and assistance of any and all educational organizations and institutions, and to do all things that may be necessary and useful in the accomplishment of the purposes hereinabove set forth.
- (b) All the assets and earnings shall be used exclusively for the purposes hereinabove set out, including the payment of expenses incidental thereto, and no part of the net earnings shall insure to the benefit of any private member insure to the benefit of any part of the net earnings shall insure to the benefit of any private member or individual, and no substantial part of the activities of the corporation shall be for the earlying on of propaganda or otherwise attempting to influence legislation. - The Corporation shall not engage in any act of self-dealing as defined in Section 4941(d) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, or corresponding provisions of any subsequent Federal tax laws.
- The Corporation shall not retain any excess business holdings as defined in section 4943 (c) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, or corresponding provisions of any subsequent Federal tax laws.
- The Corporation shall not make any investments in such manner as to subject it to tax under Section 4944 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, or corresponding provisions of any subsequent Federal tax laws.
- The Corporation shall not make any taxable expenditures as defined in Section 4945(d) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, or corresponding provisions of any subsequent Federal tax laws.

The Corporation shall have no capital stock and the private property of the incorporators and members shall not be liable for the debts of the Corporation.
