Articles of Incorporation of Astatula Police Department Charities, INC.

The undersigned, under the Florida Not for Profit Corporation Act, Florida Statutes, Chapter 617, does hereby make and adopt the following Articles of Incorporation.

Article I Name

The name of the Corporation is Astatula Police Department Charities, Inc.

Article II Address

The mailing and street address of the corporation is 25009 County Road 561, Astatula, Florida 34705.

Article III Registered Office and Agent

The street address of the registered office of business is 25009 County Road 567. Astatula, FL 34705. The registered agent is John Calhoun.

Article IV Not for Profit

The corporation is a not for profit corporation under Chapter 617, Florida Statutes. The corporation is not formed for pecuniary profit. If the corporation ever had members, no member shall have any vested right, interest or privilege in or to the assets, income or property of the corporation and no part of the income or assets of the corporation shall be distributable to or for the benefit of its members, except to the extent permissible under these Articles, under law and under § 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code.

Article V Purposes

The Corporation is organized and shall be operated exclusively for charitable purposes within the meaning of § 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code.

Article VI Powers

Solely for the purposes, the corporation shall have the following powers:

A. To exercise all rights and powers conferred by the laws of the State of Florida on nonprofit corporations, including but not limited to those set forth in Florida Statutes Chapter 617 and the following powers: to acquire by bequest, devise, gift, grant, donation, contribution, purchase, lease or otherwise dispose of the property and the income, principal and proceeds of the property.

B. To engage in and transact any other lawful activity, solely in furtherance of the above purposes for which nonprofit corporations may be incorporated under the Florida Not For Profit Corporation Ave, and any successor or amendment to the Florida Not For Profit Corporation Act.

C. To do any other things as are incidental to the powers of the corporation or necessary or desirable in order to accomplish the purposes of the corporation.

Article VII Board of Directors

The bylaws shall provide the method of election of all Directors and the number of Directors may be raised or lowered by amendment of the bylaws, but the number of Directors shall never be less than three (3).

Article IX Commencement of Corporate Existence And Duration

The Corporation began its corporate existence upon the filling and acceptance by Florida Department of State of the Article of Incorporation. The duration of the Corporation is perpetual.

Article X Tax Exempt Status

It is intended that the corporation shall have and continue to have the status of a corporation that is exempt from federal income taxation § 501(a) of the Internal Revenue Code as an organization described in § 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code. These articles shall be construed accordingly, and all powers and activities of the corporation shall be limited accordingly. The corporation shall not carry on propaganda or otherwise attempt to influence legislation to such an extent as would result in the loss of exemption under § 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code. The corporation shall not participate or intervene in any political campaign, including the publication or distribution of statement, on behalf of or in opposition to any candidate for public office. The corporation shall not carry on any other activities not permitted to be carried on by a corporation exempt from federal income tax under § 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code. All references in

these articles to sections of the Internal Revenue Code shall be considered references to the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as from time to time amended, and to the corresponding provision of any similar law subsequently enacted.

Article XI Dissolution

Upon the dissolution of the organization, assets shall be distributed for one or more exempt purposes within the meaning of § 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, or corresponding section of any future federal tax code, or shall be distributed to the federal government, or to a state or local government, for a public purpose. Any such assets not so disposed of shall be disposed of by a court of competent jurisdiction of the county in which the principal office of the organization or organizations, as said court shall determine, which are organized and operated exclusively for such purposes.

Article XII Officers

The officers of the corporation may consist of a president, one or more vice president, a secretary, a treasurer, and any other officers and assistant officers as may be provided for in the bylaws or by resolution of the board of directors. Each Officer shall be elected by majority vote of the board of the directors (and may be removed by majority vote of the board of directors) at such a time and in such a manner as may be prescribed by the bylaws or by law.
