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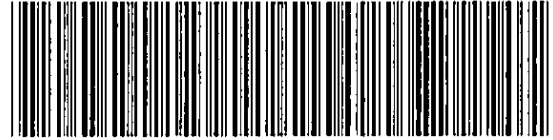

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**Attachment to ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION of
Impressions of Humanity, Inc.
A Florida "Not for Profit" Corporation**

CORPORATE PURPOSES: Notwithstanding any other provision of these articles, the Corporation shall not carry on any other activities not permitted to be carried on (a) by a corporation exempt from federal income tax under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, or the corresponding section of any future federal tax code, or (b) by a corporation, contributions to which are deductible under section 170(c)(2) of the Internal Revenue Code, or the corresponding section of any future federal tax code.

EXCLUSIVITY: The purposes for which this Corporation is formed are exclusively for charitable, religious, educational, and scientific purposes and consist of the following:

1. To create artwork representing citizens from every country. The Corporation partners with artists, organizations, and institutions worldwide to ensure representation from every country. Participants globally contribute their hand impressions on a prepared canvas regardless of age, background, or nationality. Besides the canvas, pictures, videos, and documentaries are integrated into the project. The canvases will be exhibited in museums. Artist Marcos Antonio has already gathered contributions from citizens of twenty-two countries. As he works to collect representations from the remaining 171 countries, the project's scope and impact will grow, highlighting an even broader spectrum of cultural, social, and individual narratives.
2. To do any and all lawful activities which may be necessary, useful, or desirable for the furtherance, accomplishment, fostering, or attaining foregoing purposes, either directly or indirectly, and either alone or in conjunction or cooperation with others, whether such others be persons or organizations of any kind or nature, such as corporations, firms, associations, trusts, institutions, foundations, or governmental bureaus, departments, or agencies
3. All the foregoing purposes shall be exercised exclusively for charitable and educational purposes in such a manner that the Corporation will qualify as an exempt organization under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 or the corresponding provision of any future United States Internal Revenue Law.

NO PRIVATE INUREMENT: The Corporation is not organized, nor shall it be operated for the primary purpose of generating financial gain or profit. The Corporation shall not distribute any gains, profits, or dividends to its members, officers, or other private persons, except that the Corporation shall be authorized and empowered to pay reasonable compensation for services rendered in carrying out the Corporation's charitable and education purposes. The Corporation's property, assets, profits, and net income are irrevocably dedicated to charitable and educational purposes, no part of which shall inure to the benefit of any individual.

LOBBYING AND POLITICAL CAMPAIGNS: No substantial part of the activities of the Corporation shall be the carrying on of propaganda or otherwise attempting to influence legislation, and the Corporation shall not participate in or intervene in (including the publishing or distribution of statements) any political campaign on behalf of or in opposition to any candidate for public office.

**Attachment to ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION of

DISSOLUTION: Upon the dissolution of the Corporation, assets shall be distributed for one or more exempt purposes within the meaning of section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, or the corresponding section of any future federal tax code, or shall be distributed to the federal government, or to a state or local government, for a public purpose. Any such assets not so disposed of shall be disposed of by a Court of Competent Jurisdiction of the county in which the principal office of the Corporation is then located, exclusively for such purposes or to such organization or organizations, as said Court shall determine, which are organized and operated exclusively for such purposes.

INDEMNIFICATION: To the fullest extent permitted by law, the Corporation shall indemnify its "agents," as described by law, including its directors, officers, employees, and volunteers, and including persons formerly occupying any such position, and their heirs, executors, and administrators, against all expenses, judgments, fines, settlements, and other amounts actually and reasonably incurred by them in connection with any "proceeding," and including any action by or in the right of the Corporation, because the person is or was a person as described in the Non-Profit Corporation Act. Such right of indemnification shall not be deemed exclusive of any other right to which such persons may be entitled apart from this Article. To the fullest extent permitted by law, and except as otherwise determined by the Board in a specific instance, expenses incurred by a person seeking indemnification in defending any "proceeding" shall be advanced by the Corporation of an undertaking by or on behalf of that person to repay such amount unless it is ultimately determined that the person is entitled to be indemnified by the Corporation for those expenses. The Corporation shall have the power to purchase and maintain insurance on behalf of any agent of the Corporation, to the fullest extent permitted by law, against any liability asserted against or incurred by the agent in such capacity or arising out of the agent's status as such or giving other indemnification to the extent permitted by law.

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
