ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

OP

THE BOCA GRANDE HISTORICAL SOCIETY, INC.
(A Corporation Not for Profit)

We, the undersigned, are desirous of forming a corporation under the provisions of Chapter 617 of the Florida Statutes, and agree to the following:

ARTICLE I

The name of this corporation is The Boca Grande Historical Society, Inc.

ARTICLE II

The initial location of this corporation shall be at 1678 Jose Gaspar Drive, Boca Grande, Lee County, Florida.

ARTICLE III Purposes

- Section 1. The corporation is organized exclusively for educational purposes within the meaning of Section 170(c)(2), and 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, or the corresponding provision of any future tax code ("the Code"), including, for such purposes, the making of distributions to organizations that qualify as exempt organizations under Section 501(c)(3).
- Section 2. In particular, the corporation's purpose shall be to bring together for mutual benefit those people interested in Florida history and especially in the history of Boca Grande and its environs. A better understanding of that history will help us deal constructively with current problems with roots in the past and will permit more enlightened planning for the future.
- Section 3. To carry out this purpose, the corporation will collect and preserve pertinent information about the island's and the region's past and will sponsor other activities designed to promote an enhanced interest in and knowledge of local, regional, and state history, and also the relationship of that history to the present and the projected future. The corporation intends to strive for educational programs which will meet generally accepted professional standards of scholarship and historical accuracy.
- Section 4. Notwithstanding any other provisions herein, the corporation is authorized to carry out any activities and exercise all authority not prohibited by these Articles or

ARTICLE IV Membership

There shall be no members of the corporation initially but the directors may provide for membership classification and qualifications pursuant to the Bylaws of the corporation.

ARTICLE V Term of Existence

This corporation is to exist perpetually.

ARTICLE VII Officers

The officers of the corporation and their duties shall be as provided in the Bylaws.

ARTICLE VIII Board of Directors

Section 1. The business affairs of this corporation shall be managed by the Board of Directors. This corporation shall have eight (8) directors initially. The number of directors may be changed from time to time, pursuant to the Bylaws, but shall never be less than three.

Section 2. Members of the Board of Directors shall be elected and hold office in accordance with the Bylaws.

Section 3. The names and addresses of the persons who are to serve as initial directors are the same as the subscribers listed in Article VI above.

ARTICLE IX Bylaws

Section 1. The Board of Directors of this corporation may provide such Bylaws for the conduct of its business and the carrying out of its purposes as they deem necessary from time to time.

Section 2. Upon proper notice, the Bylaws may be amended, altered or rescinded by a majority vote of those members of the Board of Directors present at any regular meeting or any special meeting called for that purpose.

ARTICLE X Amendments to Articles

These Articles of Incorporation may be amended by a majority vote of the Board of Directors or as otherwise provided by law.

ARTICLE XI No Private Inurements: Restrictions on Activities

No part of the net earnings of the corporation shall inure to the benefit of, or be distributable to its members, trustees, officers, or other private persons, except that the corporation shall be authorized and empowered to pay reasonable compensation for services rendered and to make payments and distributions in furtherance of the purposes set forth in these Articles. No substantial part of the activities of the corporation shall be the carrying on of propaganda, or otherwise attempting to influence legislation, and the corporation shall not participate in, or intervene in (including the publishing or distribution of statements) any political campaign on behalf of or in opposition to any candidate for public office. Notwithstanding any other provision of these Articles, the corporation shall not carry on any other activities not permitted to be carried on (a) by a corporation exempt from federal income tax under Section 501(c)(3) of the Code, or (b) by a corporation, contributions to which are deductible under Section 170(c)(2) of the Code.

ARTICLE XII Distribution Upon Dissolution

Upon the dissolution of the corporation, assets shall be distributed for one or more exempt purposes within the meaning of

Section 501(c)(3) of the Code, or shall be distributed to the federal government, or to a state or local government, for a public purpose. Any such assets not so disposed of shall be disposed of by a court of competent jurisdiction of the county in which the principal office of the corporation is then located, exclusively for such purposes or to such organization or organizations, as said Court shall determine, which are organized and operated exclusively for such purposes. If qualified pursuant to this Article, The Florida Historical Society Incorporated, whall receive the distributions of the corporation upon dissolution.

ARTICLE XIII Registered Office

The street address of the initial registered office of this corporation is Humphrey & Knott, P.A., 1625 Hendry Street, Fort Myers, FL 33901, and the name of the registered agent of this corporation at that address is Garey F. Butler, Esq.
