ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION
OF
SAFEGUARD OF CENTRAL FLORIDA, INC.

We the undersigned natural persons of the age of twenty-one or more, acting as incorporators of a corporation under the NON-PROFIT CORPORATION ACT OF THE STATE OF FLORIDA, adopt the following Articles of Incorporation:

ARTICLE I
NAME

The name of the corporation is **SAFEGUARD**, an acronym for "Selective Actualized Florida Expert Groups Uniting Action Researchers/Developers", hereinafter referred to as: **SAFEGUARD OF CENTRAL FLORIDA, INC.**

ARTICLE II
DURATION

The duration of **SAFEGUARD**, is perpetual.

ARTICLE III
PURPOSES AND POWERS

OF CENTRAL FLORIDA, INC.
It is the purpose of **SAFEGUARD** to operate exclusively for charitable, scientific, literary, or educational purposes as a nonprofit organization in the State of Florida. The group is organized as a culturally diverse entity to form a partnership with deprived communities around the nation and throughout the world. Its purposes are: To assist Americans gain a broader understanding of cultures in the international arena; to assist national and international communities in socioeconomic growth and development; and to provide a forum for Americans to share skills that will allow them "to bring back the world" to educate other Americans. It is an outgrowth of the

Million Woman March (MWM), Florida delegation--focusing on human rights and development, the eighth platform issue of the national charter.

Utilizing a development education concept, through a network of concerned individuals, private and public groups, SAFEGUARD OF CENTRAL FLORIDA, INC. will assist poor families, poor schools and underdeveloped businesses in this nation and throughout the world to move them into the mainstream of the global society.

SAFEGUARD OF CENTRAL FLORIDA, INC. will conduct site visits for the purpose of (1) assisting Americans to understand their own and others cultures; (2) helping underdeveloped communities help themselves to overcome years of extreme deprivation; (2) bringing them into parity with the rest of the world through voluntary resources and organizations based upon needs assessments and ascertainment of problematic areas which confront the residents of these areas; and (4) serving as catalysts and contributors to the United States' effort to help underdeveloped communities become an equal partner in the 21st Century global village. The goals include:

1. Providing skills training in: (a) Education - focusing on the needs of children, youths, families and communities; (b) Diversity - modeling how a multicultural society can celebrates its ethnoracial and gender differences by working together; (c) Training - providing workshops and seminars in business, conflict management, diversity, counseling, critical thinking skills, development, education, finances, media, research, technology, time management and proposal writing; and (d) Culture - sharing cross-cultural experiences with residents of other cultures; learning about other cultures; bringing this information back and sharing it in an organized format with other Americans who will not have the benefit of traveling globally; (e) Coaching - mentoring a designated population to assist them in developing proficiency in their expressed fields of endeavor, job shadowing them to conduct needs assessments of their performance and productivity levels and conducting training-the-trainer seminars to maximize the expertise in the specific fields.
- (2) Establishing a linkage with Corporate America, counseling associations and other entities to: (a) maximize the potential for assisting these communities; and (b) show the unity that can exist

between groups from different ethnic, business and geographical backgrounds within the same country.

Notwithstanding any other provisions of these Articles, SAFEGUARD OF CENTRAL FLORIDA, INC. is hereby organized exclusively for one or more of the following purposes: Charitable, scientific, literary, or educational purposes, as specified in Section 501 (c) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954, and will not carry on any activities not permitted to be carried on by a nonprofit corporation exempt from Federal income tax under Section 501 (c) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954.

SAFEGUARD OF CENTRAL FLORIDA, INC. is not organized, nor shall it be operated, for pecuniary gain or profit, and it does not contemplate the distribution of gains, profits or dividends to directors, officers, or any private person and is organized solely for nonprofit purposes.

SAFEGUARD OF CENTRAL FLORIDA, INC. has all powers conferred by the State of Florida Non-profit Corporation Act, including all powers necessary or convenient to effect any or all of the purposes for which SAFEGUARD OF CENTRAL FLORIDA, INC. is organized.

ARTICLE IV MEMBERS

SAFEGUARD OF CENTRAL FLORIDA, INC. is to have members. The classes of members, the qualifications and rights of the members of each class, and provision conferring, limiting or denying the right to vote shall be as provided in the By-Laws.

ARTICLE V DIRECTORS

The manner of election or appointment, term of office, and number of Directors of SAFEGUARD OF CENTRAL FLORIDA, INC. shall be as provided in the By-Laws.

ARTICLE VI DISSOLUTION

Upon dissolution of SAFEGUARD OF CENTRAL FLORIDA, INC. the Directors shall after paying or making provision for the payment of all the liabilities of SAFEGUARD OF CENTRAL FLORIDA, INC.

ARTICLE VII REGISTERED OFFICE AND REGISTERED AGENT

The name of the initial registered agent for SAFEGUARD OF CENTRAL FLORIDA, INC. at such address is LISA JENSEN, an individual actually residing in the State of Florida, Lake County.

ARTICLE VIII INITIAL BOARD OF DIRECTORS


