ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION OF JASON MUDD & ASSOCIATES, INC.

The undersigned, acting as the incorporator of JASON MUDD & ASSOCIATES, INC. under the Florida Business Corporation Act, adopts the following Articles of Incorporation for such Corporation:

ARTICLE I. NAME

The name of the Corporation is: JASON MUDD & ASSOCIATES, INC.

ARTICLE II. ADDRESS

The street address of the initial principal office is: 346 Otter Run Drive, Fernandina Beach, Florida 32034 and the mailing address of the Corporation is: P.O. Box 15542, Fernandina Beach, Florida 32035.

ARTICLE III. COMMENCEMENT OF EXISTENCE

The existence of the corporation commences on June 1, 2003, unless the filing of these Articles of Incorporation occurs more than five (5) business days thereafter, in which event such existence commences on the date of filing of these Articles of Incorporation. This election is made pursuant to §607.0123 and §607.0203, Florida Statutes.

ARTICLE IV. DURATION

The period of duration of the Corporation is perpetual.

ARTICLE V. PURPOSE

The purpose or purposes for which the Corporation is organized are to engage in any activity of business permitted under the Laws of the United States of America and of this State.

ARTICLE VI. AUTHORIZED SHARES

The maximum number of shares the Corporation is authorized to issue is 100 shares of Common Stock having a par value of \$1.00 per share.

ARTICLE VII. INITIAL REGISTERED OFFICE AND AGENT

The Corporation designates 1512 First Street South, Jacksonville Beach, Florida 32250 as the street address of the initial registered office of the Corporation and names **Henrietta "Hank" Watson**, the Corporation's initial Registered Agent at that address to accept service of process within this State.

ARTICLE VIII. INITIAL BOARD OF DIRECTORS

The Corporation has two (2) directors initially. The number of directors may be either increased or diminished from time to time as provided in the Bylaws, but will never be less than one (1). The name of the initial directors are **Francis Jason Mudd and Tabitha J. Mudd**.

ARTICLE XI. SHAREHOLDER ACTION

Two-thirds consent of the Stockholders of the Corporation shall be required for any Shareholder action.

ARTICLE XII. ADOPTION, AMENDMENT OR REPEAL OF ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

The Shareholders have the power to adopt, amend, alter, change or repeal the Articles of Incorporation when proposed and approved at a Stockholders' meeting, with not less than a two-thirds vote of the common stock.

ARTICLE XIII. PREEMPTIVE RIGHTS

The holders of the common stock of this Corporation shall have preemptive rights to purchase, at prices, terms and conditions that shall be fixed by the Board of Directors, such as the shares of the stock of this Corporation as may be issued for money or any property or services from time to time, in addition to that stock authorized and issued by the Corporation. The pre-emptive right of any holder is determined by the ratio of the authorized and issued shares of stock held by the holder of all shares of common stock currently authorized and issued.

ARTICLE XIV. INDEMNIFICATION

- (a) The corporation shall indemnify any person who is or was a party to any proceeding by reason of the fact that such person is or was a director or officer of the corporation or its subsidiaries, to the fullest extent not prohibited by law, for actions taken in the capacity of such person as a director or officer of the corporation or its subsidiaries. To the fullest extent not prohibited by law, the corporation shall advance indemnification expenses for actions taken in the capacity of such person as an officer or director, within twenty (20) days after receipt by the corporation of (1) a written statement requesting such advance, (2) evidence of the expenses incurred, and (3) a written statement by or on behalf of such person agreeing to repay the advanced expenses if it is ultimately determined that such person is not entitled to be indemnified against such expenses.
- (b) The corporation by action of its board of directors, in its sole discretion, may indemnify any person who is or was a party to any proceeding, by reason of the fact that such person is or was an employee or agent of the corporation or its subsidiaries, to the fullest extent not prohibited by law,

for actions taken in the capacity of such person as an employee or agent of the corporation or its subsidiaries. The corporation by action of its board of directors, in its sole discretion, may advance indemnification expenses for actions taken in the capacity of such person as an employee or agent, after receipt by the corporation of (1) a written statement requesting such advance, (2) evidence of the expenses incurred, and (3) a written statement by or on behalf of such person agreeing to repay the advanced expenses if it is ultimately determined that such person is not entitled to be indemnified against such expenses. Absent specific action by the board of directors, the authority granted to the board of directors in this paragraph (b) shall create no rights in the persons eligible for indemnification or advancement of expenses and shall create no obligations of the corporation relating thereto.

The undersigned incorporator, for the purpose of forming a Corporation under the laws of the State of Florida, has executed these Articles of Incorporation on June 5, 2003.
