ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION AND REDOMESTICATION

OF

WORLDWIDE CASUALTY INSURANCE COMPANY

PREAMBLE. The undersigned corporation desires to transfer its corporate domicile from the Commonwealth of Kentucky to the State of Ohio pursuant to the approval of the Ohio Superintendent of Insurance under the authority of Section 3913.40 of the Ohio Revised Code, as it now exists or may hereafter be amended, and to be recognized as a corporation from its original date of incorporation of February 17, 1981, in the Commonwealth of Kentucky.

On February 17, 1981, Capital Landmark Insurance Company was incorporated in Kentucky. The corporation changed its name to Providian Fire Insurance Company on June 30, 1995, and to Worldwide Casualty Insurance Company on October 16, 1998. The corporation remains domiciled in Kentucky.

These Articles supersede the existing Articles of Incorporation.

FIRST. The name of the corporation is Worldwide Casualty Insurance Company.

SECOND. The place in the State of Ohio where its principal office is located is the City of Cincinnati, Hamilton County. The corporation shall have full power and authority to establish offices and agencies in said city and in other parts of the State of Ohio, and in other states and territories and in foreign countries.

THIRD. The corporation is organized for the purpose of making, and it shall have the full power and authority to make and undertake, all of the kinds of insurance and reinsurance (except with respect to life insurance, contracts for the payment of annuities and title insurance) which are now or may hereafter be permitted to domestic stock fire, marine and casualty companies under the laws of the State of Ohio. The corporation shall have the power and authority to make and undertake any and all kinds of insurance and reinsurance (except with respect to life insurance, contracts for the payment of annuities and title insurance) in other states and outside the United States of America, its territories and possessions, so long as all other applicable requirements of law are met.

The foregoing statement of purpose shall not be held to limit or restrict the powers of the corporation to carry on, and the corporation shall have the power to carry on, any other business it may lawfully do.

FOURTH. The maximum number of voting common shares which the corporation is authorized to issue shall be Ten Thousand (10,000) with a par value of One Hundred Dollars (\$100) each. The capital and surplus of the corporation shall be in the aggregate amount of not less than Five Million Dollars (\$5,000,000), which aggregate shall include paid-in capital of not less than One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000) and contributed surplus of not less than One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000).

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FIFTH. The duration of the corporation shall be perpetual.

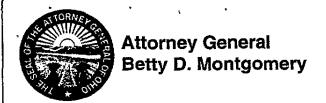
