

THE UNDERSIGNED, each with the capacity to contract, hereby executes and acknowledges these Articles of Incorporation for the purpose of forming a corporation not for profit under and by virtue of the laws of the state of Florida. THE UNDERSIGNED HEREBY ADOPTS THE FOLLOWING ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION.

ARTICLE 1. NAME

The name of this corporation shall be SMITH CHAPEL BIBLE UNIVERSITY, INC . The physical address of the corporation is 1931 WELBY WAY STE 4 TALLAHASSEE FL 32308 The mailing address of the corporation is 1931 WELBY WAY STE 4 TALLAHASSEE FL 32308 .

ARTICLE 2. PURPOSE

The specific purpose for which the corporation is initially organized: Smith Chapel Bible University (SCBU), a post-secondary academic education and faith-based institution, offer students an education based on biblical faith illuminated in the Holy Bible (Authorized King James Version). This faith develops their intellectual maturity, wisdom, and Christian faith for the purpose of serving the family, community, church, and world through a personal relationship with our CHANCELLOR, Saviour and Lord Christ, Jesus. SCBU also engages in activities which are necessary, suitable or convenient for the accomplishment of that purpose, or which are incidental thereto or connected therewith which are consistent with Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code. This corporation is organized and operated exclusively for educational purposes within the meaning of Section 501(c)(3), Internal Revenue Code.

Notwithstanding any other provision of these articles, this corporation will not carry on any other activities not permitted to be carried on by (i) a corporation exempt from federal income tax under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 or the corresponding provision of any future United States Internal Revenue law, or (ii) a corporation, contributions to which are deductible under Section 170(c)(2) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 or any other corresponding provision of any future United States Internal Revenue law. The purposes for which this corporation is organized are exclusively charitable, scientific, literary and educational within the meaning of Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 or the corresponding provision of any future United States Internal Revenue law.

ARTICLE 3. QUALIFICATION OF MEMBERS AND MANNER OF ADMISSION

The corporation will have voting and non-voting members which will be detailed in The Board of Trustees Policy Manual.

Furthermore, non-voting members of the corporation shall consist of any qualified person accepted by the board of trustees expressing a desire to help further the purposes for which the corporation was organized, and who based on a contractual arrangement contribute time, expertise, service, tuition or fees for this regard. Voting-members must be of noble character, and good reputation within the community, and who are willing to commit time and money for these purposes may, upon request, be admitted to membership by vote of majority of the board of directors.

ARTICLE 4. TERM

The date of commencement of corporate existence shall be when these articles have been filed with the Department of State and approved by it and the respective filing fee has been paid; the term for which the corporation is to exist shall be perpetual. This corporation is organized and operated exclusively for educational purposes within the meaning of Section 501(c)(3), Internal Revenue Code. In the event of dissolution of the corporation, no part of the corporation's earnings or assets shall inure to the benefit of any of its members; the residual assets of the corporation shall be distributed to one or more organizations which themselves are exempt as organizations described in Sections 501(c)(3) and 170(c)(2) of the Internal Revenue code of 1986, or corresponding sections of any prior or future law, or to the federal, state or local government for exclusive public purpose.

ARTICLE 5. NON FOR PROFIT ORGANIZATION

No part of the net earning of the corporation shall ever inure to the benefit of, or be distributable to its members, directors, officers, or other private persons, except that the corporation shall be authorized and empowered to pay reasonable compensation for services rendered and to make payments and distributions in furtherance of the purposes set forth in article 2. No substantial part of the activities of the corporation shall be the carrying on of propaganda, or otherwise attempting to influence legislation and the corporation shall not participate in, or intervene in (including the publishing or distribution of statements) any political campaign on behalf of any candidate for public office.

Notwithstanding any other provision of these articles, the corporation shall not carry on any other activities not permitted to be carried on: (a) by a corporation exempt from Federal Income Tax under Section 501(C)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 or the corresponding provision of any future United States Internal Revenue law or: (b) by a corporation, contributions to which are deductible under Section 170(C) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 or the corresponding provisions of any future United States Internal Revenue laws.

ARTICLE 6, INITIAL REGISTERED OFFICE AND AGENT

The name of the Initial Registered Agent of the corporation is DR ABE JOHNSON, and the street address of the Initial Registered Agent of this corporation is 4085 BOTHWELL TERR TALLAHASSEE FL 32317.

ARTICLE 7. INCORPORATOR

ARTICLE 8. TRUSTEES

The board of trustees of the corporation shall consist of no less than three (3) trustees as determined by the Board of Trustees Policy Manual. Trustees shall be elected at the annual meeting of the members in the manner set forth in the bylaws. Trustees may be removed and the vacancies shall be filled in the manner provided by the Board of Trustees Policy Manual. The trustees named in these articles shall serve as trustees for the ensuing year, or until the first annual meeting of the corporation, and any vacancies before then shall be filled in the manner set forth in the Board of Trustees Policy Manual. The board of trustees shall have the authority to make provision for reasonable compensation to its members for their services as trustees and to fix the basis and conditions upon which this compensation shall be paid. Any trustee may also serve the corporation in any other capacity and receive compensation there from in any form. The trustees whose positions and duties are set forth in the Board of Trustees Policy Manual will manage the affairs of this corporation. ARTICLE 10. AMENDMENTS TO ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

These articles of incorporation may be amended in the manner provided by statute or in the following manner:
