ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

In Compliance with Chapter 617, F.S., (Not for Profit) 2008 MAR -7 PM 2: 47

SECRETARY OF STATE TALLAHASSEE, FLORIDA

ARTICLE I NAME

The name of the corporation shall be: Second Chance for Youth & Families, Inc.

PRINCIPLE OFFICE

The principle place of business and mailing address of this corporation shall be: 7841 NW 53rd Court Lauderhill, Florida 33351

ARTICLE III **PURPOSE**

The purpose for which the corporation is organized is:

- 1. To provide transitional housing, which incorporates independent living skills that will provide training, self-sufficiency, life skills, and independent base training.
- 2. To provide alternative living environment training, educational and vocational training support systems that lead to independent living.
- 3. To provide educational placement, career training, mentoring, academic enrichment support and services, crises and anger management training for at-risk youth and families within the State of Florida and beyond.
- 4. To provide congregate assisted living for juveniles in a group home foster care setting, offering full and part-time, temporary and permanent living facilities within the State of Florida and beyond.
- 5. To purchase or otherwise acquire, hold, own, develop, manage or operate, sell, convey, lease, mortgage, encumber, exchange, improve and otherwise deal in and dispose of real estate and real, mixed and personal property, goods, wares, and merchandise, and any interest and rights therein without limit as to amount and kind.
- 6. To purchase, construct, lease or otherwise acquire, and to won, operate, mortgage and dispose of such buildings and structures, with the necessary plant, equipment and machinery as may be found useful and convenient for the purpose of the business aforesaid.
- 7. To enter into, make and perform contracts of every kind and description with any person, form, association, corporation, municipality, city, state, body politic or government.

- 8. To borrow or raise monies for nay of the purpose of the Corporation, and from time to time without limit as to amount to draw, make accept, endorse, execute and issue promissory notes, drafts, bills of exchange, warrants, bonds, debentures and other negotiable or nonnegotiable Instruments and evidence of indebtedness, and to secure the payment of any thereof, and of the interest thereof by mortgage upon pledge, conveyance or assignment in trust of the whole or any part of the property of the Corporation, whether at the time owned or thereafter acquired, and to sell, pledge or otherwise dispose or such bonds or other obligations of the Corporation for its corporate purpose.
- 9. To apply for, obtain, purchase or otherwise acquire, any patents, copyrights, licenses, trademarks, trade names, rights, purposes, formulae and the like, which might be used for any of the purposes of the Corporation; and to use, exercise, develop, grant licenses in respect of, sell and otherwise turn to account, the same.

Said corporation is organized exclusively for charitable, religious, educational, and scientific purposes, the making of distributions to organizations that qualify as exempt organizations under 501 (c) (3) of the Internal Revenue code, or the corresponding section of any future federal tax code.

No part of the net earnings of the corporation shall insure to the benefit of, or be distributed to its members, trustees, officers, or other private persons, except that the corporation shall be authorized and empowered to pay reasonable compensation for services rendered and to make payments and distributions in furtherance of the purposes set forth in Article Third hereof. No substantial part of the activities of the corporation shall be the carrying on of propaganda, or otherwise attempting to influence legislation, and the corporation shall not participate in, or intervene in (including the publishing or distribution of statements) any political campaign on behalf of or in opposition to any candidate for public office. Notwithstanding any other provision of these articles, the corporation shall not carry on any other activities not permitted to be carried on (a) by a corporation exempt from federal income tax under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, or the corresponding section of any future federal tax code, or (b) by a corporation, contributions to which are deductible under section 170(c)(2) of the Internal Revenue Code, or the corresponding section of any future federal tax code.

Upon the dissolution of the corporation, assets shall be distributed for one or more exempt purposes within the meaning of Section 501©(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, or the corresponding section of any future federal tax code, or shall be distributed to the federal government, or to a state or local government, for a public purpose. Any such assets not so disposed of shall be disposed of by a Court of Competent Jurisdiction of the county in which the principle office of the corporation is then located, exclusively for such purposes or to such organization or organizations, as said Court shall determine, which are organized and operated exclusively for such purposes.
