ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

ARTICLE I NAME

Central Philippine University Alumni Association of Florida Inc., a non-profit corporation successors and assigns.

ARTICLE II DEFINITION

Section 1-"Association" shall mean and refer to The Central Philippine University Alumni Association of Florida Inc.

Sectionn2-"Member" shall mean and refer to those persons entitled to membership as provided in Article V, on Membership.

Section 3- The Association shall be defined as a Not-for Profit Corporation under Section 501(c) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954 (or the corresponding provision of any future United States Internal Revenue Law.)

Section 4-No part of the net earnings of the Association shall inure to the benefit of, or to be distributable to its members, trustees, officers or other private persons.

Section 5-No substantial part of the activities of the Association shall be the carrying on of propaganda, or otherwise attempting to influence legislation and, the Association shall not participate in, nor intervene in(including the publishing or distribution of statements) any political campaign on behalf of any candidate for public office. Notwithstanding any provision of this document, the Association shall not carry on any other activities not permitted to be carried on (a) by an association exempt from any federal income tax under Section 501 (C)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954, or corresponding section of any future Federal Tax Code, or (b) by an association, contributions to which are deductible, under Section 170 (c)(2) of the Internal Revenue Code, or corresponding section of any future Federal Tax Code.

Section 5 – Compensation and Authorized Expenses. No director shall receive compensation for any service he/she may render to the Association. However, any Director may be reimbursed for his/her actual expenses incurred but which are limited to postage, stationary, and related office supplies and which shall be covered by receipts and duly approved by the President of the Association. Any other expenses beyond what is heretofore stated, shall require a duly seconded and carried motion in a Board meeting and which carried motion (s) shall be duly recorded in the official minutes of meetings.

ARTICLE III PRINCIPAL OFFICE 3911 Rock Hill Loop, Apopka, Florida 32712

ARTICLE IV PURPOSE

To organize all the alumni of Central Philippine University (CPU) in Florida for a closer cooperation and collaboration among themselves in order to support the goals and programs of the University. This will include raising funds so that these objectives shall be achieved.

ARTICLE V- MEMBERSHIP

- Section 1. The members of the Association shall be classified as regular, associate and honorary.
- Section 2. The regular members are the following:
 - (a) Holders of any degree, diploma or any certificate from Central Philippine University, Central Philippine College (CPC) or Jaro Industrial School.
 - (b) Former students of Central Philippine University, Central Philippine College or Jaro Industrial School.
- Section 3. The associate members are the spouses and children of members. These spouses and children are not graduates or students of CPU.
- Section 4. The honorary members are the following:
 - (a) Holders of honorary academic degrees from CPU or CPC.
 - (b) Persons who are, or have been members of the Board of Trustees, the Faculty and Staff of the University.
 - (c) Other persons who have rendered or are rendering meritorious service to CPU or the Association upon recommendation of the chapter.

<u>ARTICLE VI – OFFICERS</u>

The officers of the Association shall consist of the following: President, a first Vice-President, four regional Vice-Presidents representing the Central, Northern, Gulf Coast and Southern regions of the state, secretary and assistant secretaries, a treasurer and assistant treasurer, an auditor, a public relations officer and assistant, social events coordinator, religious events coordinator, a parliamentarian, and a historian.

ARTICLE VII- FEES

Section 1. Every regular, associate or honorary member shall pay an annual fee of \$20 upon registration and \$15 for every year thereafter.

Section 2. Members who shall pay the amount of \$100 shall be entitled to Life Membership.

ARTICLE VIII - RIGHTS AND RESPONSIBILITIES OF MEMBERS

Section 1; All members, regular, associate and honorary who shall pay their annual dues are members of good standing and shall have the following rights and responsibilities:

- Sec. 1.1. Attend the regular and special meetings.
- Sec. 1.2. Give the chapter secretary their street and email addresses and notify him or her of any changes thereof.
 - Sec1.3. Attend special events and activities of CPU to which they are invited.
 - Sec. !.4. Participate in the electoral process, either as a candidate or as a voter.

ARTICLE IX MANNER OF ELECTION

The officers/directors of the corporation shall be elected by a majority of votes cast by members of the association present at a regular meeting intended for that purpose and shall serve for a term of two years or until their successors have been elected.

Article X – RESOLUTION AND DISSOLUTION OF ASSOCIATION

Upon the Dissolution of this Association, assets shall be distributed for one (1) or more exempt purposes within the meaning of Section 501 (c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code or corresponding section of any future Federal Tax Code, or shall be distributed to the federal government, or to a state or local government, for a public purpose. Any such assets not disposed of, shall be disposed of by the Court of Common Pleas of the County un which the principal office of the organization is then located, exclusively for such purposes or to such organization, as said Court shall determine, which are organized and operated for such purposes.
