The undersigned subscriber to these articles of incorporation is a natural person competent to contract and hereby form a non-profit corporation under Chapter 617 of the Florida Statutes.

Article 1: Name

The name of the Corporation is **Ajigbotifa Temple Miami- Home of Traditional Solutions Inc.**, (Hereinafter addressed as "Corporation").

Article 2- Purpose of Corporation

The Corporation is organized exclusively for charitable, religious, educational, and scientific purposes, including, for such purposes, the making of distributions to organizations that qualify as exempt organization under section 501 (c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, or the corresponding section of any future federal tax code.

Article 3- PROHIBITIONS

No part of the net earnings of the Corporation shall inure to the benefit of, or be distributable to its members, trustees, officers, or other private persons, except that the Corporation shall be authorized and empowered to pay reasonable compensation for services rendered and to make payments and distributions in furtherance of the purposes set forth in the Article second hereof. No substantial part of the activities of the Corporation shall be the carrying on of propaganda, or otherwise attempting to influence legislation, and the Corporation shall not participate in, or intervene in (including the

publishing or distribution of statements) any political campaign on behalf of or in opposition to any candidate for public office. Notwithstanding any other provision of these articles, the Corporation shall not engage in any activities not permitted to be carried on (a) by a Corporation exempt from federal income tax under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, or the corresponding section of any future federal tax code, or (b) by a Corporation, contributions which are deductible under section 170(c)(2) of the Internal Revenue Code, or the corresponding section of any future federal tax code.

Article 4- DIRECTORS

The Directors shall be elected by a majority vote by the members of the Corporation as outlined in in the Corporation bylaws. The Initial Directors of this Corporation shall be:

Article 8- Term of Existence

This corporation shall have perpetual existence.

Article 9- Capital Stock

This Corporation shall have no capital stock and shall be composed of members rather than shareholders.

Article 10- Membership

The categories of membership, eligibility and revocation shall be set forth and regulated by the bylaws of the Corporation.

Article 11- Voting Rights

Members of the Corporation will have such voting rights as are provided in the bylaws of the Corporation.

Article 12- Liabilities For Debts

Neither the members nor the members of the Board of the Corporation or officers of the corporation shall be liable for the debts of the corporation.

Article 12- Registered Office and Registered Agent

Article 14- Effective Date

These articles of Incorporation shall be effective immediately upon approval of the Secretary of State, State of Florida.

Article 15- Amendment

These Articles of Incorporation may be amended in the manner provided by state law. Every amendment shall be approved by the Board of the Corporation, proposed to them by members, and approved at annual meetings or other meeting set forth and deemed appropriate by the Board. Approval of amendments will be based upon majority vote.

Article 16- Indemnification

The Corporation shall indemnify a director or officer of the Corporation who was wholly successful, on the merits or otherwise, in the defense of any proceeding to which the director or officer was a party because the director or officer is or was a director or officer of the Corporation against reasonable attorney fees and expenses incurred by the director or officer in connection with the proceeding. The corporation may indemnify an individual made a party to a proceeding because the individual is or was a director, officer, employee or agent of the Corporation against liability if authorized in the specific case after determination, in the manner required by the Board of the Corporation, that indemnification of the director, officer,

employee or agent, as the case may be, is permissible in the circumstances because the director, officer, employee or agent has met the standard of conduct set forth by the Board of the Corporation. The indemnification and advancement of attorney fees and the expenses for directors, officers, employees and agents of the Corporation shall apply when such persons are serving at the Corporation's request while a director, officer, partner, trustee, employee or agent of another foreign or domestic Corporation. partnership, joint venture, trust, employee benefit plan or other enterprise, whether or not for profit, as well as in their official capacity with the Corporation. The Corporation also may pay for or reimburse the reasonable attorney fees and expenses incurred by a director, officer, employee or agent of the Corporation who is a party to a proceeding in advance of final disposition of the proceeding. The Corporation also may purchase and maintain insurance on behalf of an individual arising from the individual's status as director, officer, employee or agent of the Corporation, whether or not the Corporation would have power to indemnify the individual against the same liability under the law. All references in these Articles of Incorporation are deemed to include any amendments or successor thereto. Nothing contained in these Articles of Incorporation shall limit or preclude the exercise of any right relating to indemnification or advance of attorney fees and expenses to any person who is or was a director, officer, employee or agent of the corporation or the ability of the Corporation otherwise to indemnify or advance expenses to any such person by contract or in any other manner. If any word, clause or sentence of the foregoing provisions regarding indemnification or advancement of the attorney fees or expenses shall be held invalid as contrary to law or public policy, it shall be severable and the provisions remaining shall not be otherwise affected. All references in these Articles of Incorporation to "director". "officer", "employee" and "agent" shall include the heirs. Estates. executors, Administrators and personal representatives of such persons.

Article 17-Dissolution

Upon dissolution of the Corporation, assets shall be distributed for one or more exempt purposes within the meaning of section 501(C)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, or the corresponding section of any future federal tax code, or shall be distributed to the federal government, or to a state or local government for public purpose. Any such assets not so disposed of shall be disposed of by Court of Competent Jurisdiction of the county in which the principal office of the corporation is then located, exclusively for such purposes or to such organization or organizations, as said Court shall determine, which are organized and operated exclusively for such purposes.
