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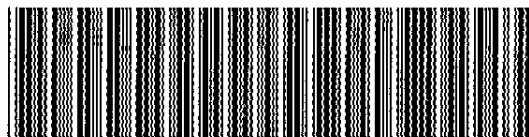


The name of the corporation is Milton Gene Friedman, CPA, P.A..
