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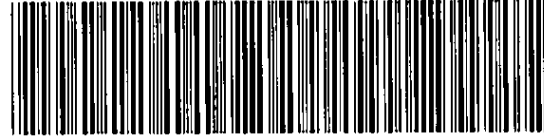

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CHAPTER

Articles of Incorporation of the Duval County Agricultural, Horticultural and Industrial Association

The undersigned of the

Duval County Agricultural, Horticultural and
Industrial Association in order to the
lawful incorporation of said Association
in conformity with the provisions of an Act
of the Legislature of the State of Florida
entitled "An Act to provide for the creation
of corporations and prescribe their general
powers and liabilities" Approved August
9th 1868 do hereby and in obedience to
the requirements of said Act adopt the
following articles of Incorporation to wit:-

1. That the corporate name of this Association
by which it may sue and be sued, plead
and be impleaded in any Court of law or
equity and in which all its business shall
be done is the "Duval County Agricultural,
Horticultural and Industrial Association."
and its place of business shall be at Jacksonville
Duval County State of Florida.

2. That the general nature of the business of
the Association shall be to encourage and
promote the Agricultural, Horticultural
and Industrial interests of the County of

Doral and State of Florida at large by the purchase, improvements and permanent establishment of suitable Fair grounds in the County of Doral for Agricultural, Horticultural and Industrial Fairs, and by any and all means and methods that may or can be legally employed in promoting and effectuating the general objects as above expressed.

3 That the capital stock of the Corporation shall be Twelve hundred dollars and shall be divided into Twelve shares of one hundred dollars each to be paid in the lawful currency of the United States by such installments as the Board of Directors of the Corporation may from time to time require.

4 The stockholders at their annual meeting shall elect six directors and said Directors shall as soon as may be thereafter elect from their own body a President, Secretary and Treasurer from among the stockholders of said Corporation and the said Directors and Officers shall transact the business of the Company and shall continue until their successors are duly elected and qualified and should there at any time occur a vacancy in any of said offices or in the Board of Directors the Directors shall be authorized to fill such

vacancy for the unexpired term by election -
5 Annual meetings shall be held on the third
Tuesday in October in each year -

6 That the Corporation may contract and
be contracted with and make and use, a
common seal and alter the same at pleasure
and may hold, buy, mortgages or otherwise
convey such estate real, personal and mixed
as shall be necessary or requisite for the Corporation
to acquire in order to secure the payment of
any indebtedness or liability belonging to the
Corporation -

7 That the Corporation shall have authority to
appoint such subordinate officers and agents
as the business of the Corporation shall require
and to allow them suitable compensation -

8 That the Corporation by its President and
directors may make by laws not inconsistent
with the laws of the State, in management
of its property, the conduct of its business, the
regulation of its affairs, and for the transfer of
its assets -

9 That the capital stock may be increased or
diminished by a vote of the stockholders of
the Corporation to be taken in cash or the by laws
may direct, and in like manner its corporate
name may be changed and also the number
of its directors, according to the directions and

under the limitations contained in the second section of the aforesaid Act.

10 That the indebtedness or liability shall at no time exceed the sum of Twenty five thousand dollars and its existence as a corporation shall commence at the date of the filing of a copy of the articles of Incorporation in the office of the Secretary of State and in the office of the Board of Equalization as required by the said Act and shall terminate ninety nine years thereafter

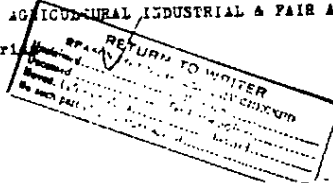
