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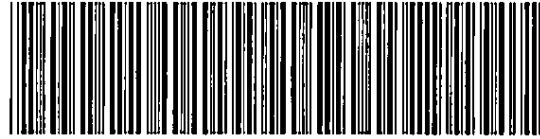

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CHARTER

Articles of Incorporation of the East Cooperative Association

The, East Maine, & S. Maine
Co-operative Association, Inc.
James J. Smith, C. P. Collins,
J. H. Wilson, C. M. Bingham,
E. E. Dayton, and all of us
together with such other persons
being hereunto associated with us as
a corporate body in form to be
known as the East Cooperative
Association, and being for such
corporation as the incorporators
and subscribers consent to and
conferred upon the corporation
by the laws of the State of Maine
and we do hereby adopt the
following Articles of Incorporation:

The name of the corporation
shall be the East Cooperative
Association, and the principal place
of business shall be at Easton,
County of York, State of
Maine. And the business of the

transacted by it shall be a
general commercial business, which
shall be conducted in and to the
buying and selling of a stock
and securities.

Article II

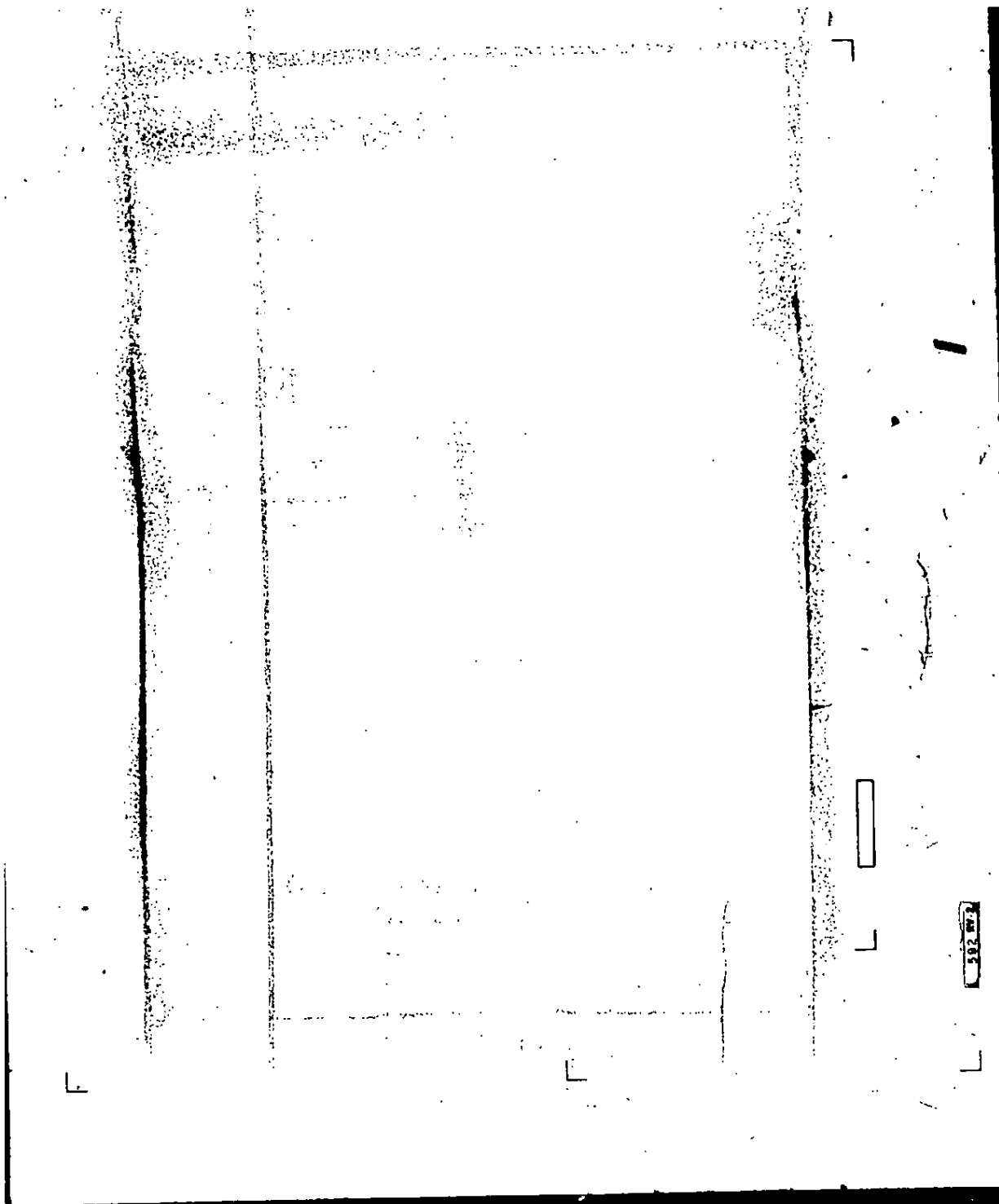
This Corporation shall be vested
with full powers to make such
contracts and engagements as may
be necessary for the purpose of
carrying into effect the objects
of the corporation, and may
from time to time make all
such By Laws and Regulations for
its government as may be
deemed expedient and not
inconsistent with the laws of this
State or of these articles.

Article III

The Capital Stock of this Corporation
shall be Five Thousand (5000) Dollars
to be divided into Shares of Five
(500) Dollars each, to be paid into
the treasury on delivery of
certificates of Stock, which shall
not be transferable. The certificates

Stock may at any time be
increased by the Committee of
Management, or on a petition of
the Stockholders, signed by at least
three thirds of them.

On demand of any person
for a dividend, the directors may
pay all paid up stock, said
direct to the paid at the
end of each fiscal year.
Any Stockholder may withdraw
from the Society by giving
written notice to the Secretary, or
writing to the Secretary of such
institution, who shall not the exis-
tence of their society shall pay
such Stockholder the amount of
his stock with accrued interest and
profits of any kind in full at date of
such notice. But in case of
dissolution, or the death of a Stockholder
the same shall be paid to the
Committee of Management
for him or her or their legal rep-
resentation. Their stock, interest and
profits in full of all claims and
debts they may have in this
Corporation.



Article IV

This corporation shall be managed by a Committee of Management, consisting of the President, Secretary and Treasurer, and such other officers as the stockholders shall elect at a general meeting of the stockholders in each year. The stockholders shall be entitled to vote in person or by proxy, and the vote of each share shall be one vote.

Article V

The private property of each stockholder shall be exempt from any corporate debts.

Article VI

It is hereby stipulated and agreed that the first annual election of this corporation shall be held on the first day of January, 1901, and thereafter the successors are chosen and qualified. The following corporation shall exist:

Article 15a

This corporation may be dissolved, or these Articles amended by a two thirds vote of the stockholders. After 30 days having been given of such dissolution or amendments and when at any time the same shall be dissolved, the directors shall take charge or possession of all money, books, goods and property of all and any kind whatsoever belonging to this corporation. And shall be liable on his bond for the faithful discharge of his duties in the distribution or disposal of the same.

Article 16a

To the end that these articles may be duly filed and recorded, it is provided by the laws of the State of Florida. The records be
