Time limited to find donor, complete transplant

"Donors make a difference: Platelets much in demand" (March 27 article) was both educational and informative. For me, however, it had a much more personal and inspirational meaning.

On Feb. 4, while I was on a leisurely visit to California to see my daughter, Jacquelyn (Boswell) Hightower; her husband, Steve; and Madelyn, their 2½-year-old daughter, Jacque was diagnosed with acute lymphoblastic leukemia. She was immediately hospitalized and began her chemotherapy the next day. She has had about seven weeks of her 10-week induction therapy after which time we pray she will go into remission.

All of the percentages have gone against her thus far. She had a 44 percent chance that her siblings, David and/or Amy Boswell, would have compatible bone marrow in case she should require a bone marrow transplant. She had a 75 percent chance that she would not have the Philadelphia chromosome present in her leukemia cells which would mean her bone marrow could never again produce normal, healthy blood cells. She has been told neither her brother nor sister is compatible and she does have the Philadelphia chromosome making it imperative that she have a bone marrow transplant. Her only hope and chance to live longer than six months is to locate an unrelated donor of bone marrow which is a very close match to her blood typing.

A bone marrow search through the National Bone Marrow Bank showed there were no donors available. An internation-

al search was done and two people were located in Italy, but the DNA check proved lacking. Six months can become a very small window of time to find a donor and complete a transplant.

Now readers can understand why the March 27 article gave me hope and appeared to be an answer to prayer. It gives us a place to begin to try to reach people, to make a plea for their response to try to be an instrument in saving my daughter's life. If their blood platelets don't match for Jacque, maybe they can save someone else's life.

I never knew much about leukemia. In a short span of time, I have become a quick study and realize how each of us has the ability to give the gift of life to another. Awareness is half of the struggle.

I was so impressed with Rick Apgar who, according to the article, donates platelets on a regular schedule with no strings attached, no pressure to do so. He must have a heart of gold to be so caring and generous and aware of helping others.

When my granddaughter prays, "Dear Jesus, make my mommy better. I need her and miss her so much," it breaks my heart and that of Jacque's dad, Jack Boswell.

If my story touches people's hearts and they feel nudged to respond out of compassion, I thank them in advance for their love and concern and any prayers they might care to send our way.
