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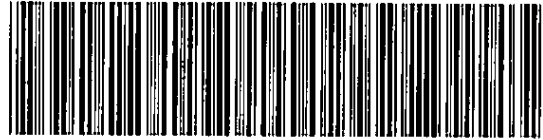

ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION
OF
FLORAL DECORATIVE STUDIOS, INCORPORATED

Article 1. The name of this corporation shall be "Floral Decorative Studios, Incorporated", and its principal place of business shall be in the city of St. Petersburg, Pinellas County, Florida, but it shall have power to establish and maintain branch offices at such other place or places as may be designated by the Board of Directors.

Article 2. The general nature of the business to be conducted, engaged in and transacted by this said corporation shall be as follows:

a. To buy sell, grow, prepare, manufacture, and generally deal in and with palmetto, flax, hemp, jute, wool, silk, cotton, paper, hair, broom-corn, grass, cane, bamboo, wood, plant, plant-roots, fiber and fibrous materials and plant and vegetable ^{materials} and substances in all and whatever form, their products and by-products;

b. To bleach, dye, print, paint, color and other ^{also} treat and manipulate, and to spin, comb, weave and prepare for the market wholly or in part any and all such products, by products, materials, manufacturers and substances;

c. To establish, conduct and carry on the general business of a manufacturer of specialties and notions of any and all kinds and descriptions;

d. To establish, conduct and carry on the general business of a distributor of specialties and notions of any and all kinds and descriptions;

e. To carry on a mail-order business;

Article 3. The total authorized capital stock of this corporation shall consist of one hundred (100) shares, amounting to one thousand (\$1000) dollars, of common stock of the par value of ten (\$10) dollars per each share.

Article 4. The amount of capital with which this corporation shall begin business shall be five hundred (\$500) dollars or more.

Article 5. The term for which this corporation shall exist is ninety-nine years, or until dissolved according to law.

Article 6. The capital stock of this corporation shall be paid for by the subscribers thereof, in lawful money of the United States, provided however that the Board of Directors may in their judgment accept real or personal property, labor or services at a just valuation to be fixed by them in payment of capital stock which valuation shall at least be equivalent to the full par value of the stock to be issued.

Article 7. The management and control of the business and property of this corporation shall vest in a Board of not less than three nor more than thirteen Directors, the number of Directors to be determined by the owners of the majority of the Common Stock at any annual meeting, or special meeting called for the purpose of electing Directors, providing that a majority of the Common Stock shall be present at such meeting; and until such meeting, the management shall vest in a Board of three Directors who shall hold their offices until their successors are elected and qualified.

The Board of Directors may select from its members a chairman of the Board of Directors, a chairman of the Finance Committee, a President, one or more Vice Presidents, a Treasurer and a Secretary and such other officers as it may from time to time designate and provide for. One person may hold more than one office.

The Board of Directors, by an affirmative vote of the whole Board, may select from the Directors a Finance Committee of which a majority shall constitute a quorum, and, to such extent as shall be provided by the by-laws, such committee shall have and may exercise all and any of the powers of the Board of Directors, including power to cause the seal of the corporation to be affixed to all papers that may require it. The incorporators or the Board of Directors may leave unfilled any office ^{except} of President, Vice-President, Treasurer and Secretary. Any officer selected by the Board of Directors may be removed at any time by the affirmative vote of a majority of the whole Board of Directors. The powers and duties of the Directors, Officers, and Finance Committee shall be prescribed by the by-laws adopted by the stockholders.

This corporation shall hold an annual meeting of its stockholders on the third Friday in January of each and every year during the period of its existence at its offices in the City of St. Petersburg Florida at which meeting its Directors shall be elected, and all the officers of the corporation shall be elected at their first meeting after their selection as Directors.

Article 8. The names and addresses of the persons who shall conduct the business of the corporation as its temporary Board of Directors and officers until their successors are elected and qualified are as follows:

Article 9. The stockholders shall have power to make, alter or amend the by-laws by a vote of three-fourths of the Common Stock of the corporation at a meeting of the stockholders called for that purpose.

Article 10. The Directors shall have power, by a majority vote, to pass additional and supplementary by-laws, and may alter, amend and repeal the same, but such by-laws are subject to the by-laws of the stockholders, and may be altered or repealed by the stockholders at any annual or special meeting, provided that notice of such alteration or repeal be included in notice of the meeting.

Article 11. It is the intention that each of the objects, purposes and powers of the second Article hereof shall be regarded as independent objects, purposes and powers.
