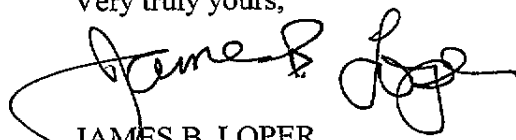

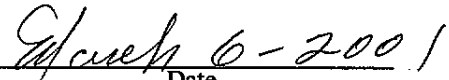

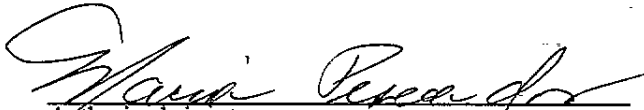

ARTICLE VIII.

The by-laws of this corporation shall be made, altered or rescinded by resolution passed by a majority vote of the members present and voting at a special meeting of the members of the corporation called for that specific purpose.

ARTICLE IX.

The highest amount of indebtedness or liability to which this corporation shall at any time subject itself shall be fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000.00), and shall never be greater than two thirds of the value of the property of the corporation.

ARTICLE X.

The amount in value of the real estate which this corporation shall hold, subject always to the approval of the Circuit Judge, shall not exceed one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000.00).

ARTICLE XI.

Section 1. CLASS.

(a) This corporation shall be a corporation not for profit, organized and existing under the laws of the State of Florida.

Section 2. MEMBERS.

(a) The annual meeting of the members of this corporation shall be held on the second Tuesday in December of each and every year, at 8:00 o'clock p. m., beginning with the year 1925.

(b) The members of this corporation shall hold such other regular or special meetings as may be fixed by the bylaws of the corporation.

(c) Notice of the meetings of the members of this corporation shall be given in such manner as may be fixed by the by-laws of the corporation.

(d) All meetings of the members of this corporation shall be held at the labor temple of the corporation.

(e) Each member of this corporation shall be entitled to one vote, and no more, at each election of officers and directors, and upon each proposal submitted at any meeting of the members of the corporation.

Section 3. OFFICERS AND DIRECTORS.

(a) The officers and directors of this corporation shall be members of the corporation.

(b) The officers of this corporation shall be directors of the corporation.

(c) The officers and directors of this corporation shall be elected by the members at the regular annual meeting of the members of the corporation.

(d) The officers and directors of this corporation shall hold office for the term of one year, beginning with the second Tuesday in January in one year when they take office until the second Tuesday in January of the following year when their successors take office; subject, of course, to death, or resignation, or removal as may be fixed by the by-laws of the corporation.

(e) In the event of death, or resignation, or removal of any officer or director of this corporation, a new officer or director, to fill such vacancy, to take office immediately and to hold office until the next regularly elected officers and directors take office, shall be elected by the members at a special meeting of the members of the corporation called for that specific purpose.

(f) The officers and directors of this corporation shall have such powers and duties as may be fixed by the by-laws of the corporation.

Section 4. RESTRICTIONS ON POWERS OF OFFICERS AND DIRECTORS.

(a) The officers and directors of this corporation shall not have the power to sell, mortgage, lease or otherwise encumber or dispose of the real property of the corporation, unless authorized, at a special meeting of the members of the corporation, called for that specific purpose, by resolution passed by a two-thirds vote of all the members of the corporation.

Section 5. AMENDMENT OF CHARTER.

(a) The charter of this corporation shall be amended by resolution passed by a majority vote of the members present and voting at a special meeting of the members of the corporation called for that specific purpose; except that the provisions of this charter restricting the power of the officers and directors to sell, mortgage, lease, or otherwise dispose of the real property of the corporation, shall be amended at a special meeting of the members of the corporation called for that specific purpose, by resolution passed by a two-thirds vote of all the members of the corporation.

And, resolved further, that the officers of said corporation subscribe, acknowledge, and, after giving due notice, present the said amended charter of said corporation to the Honorable F. M. CHARTER
OF THE
