Attorney indicted on Medicare fraud

During 30 years of practice, Miami civil attorney Harold Braxton never had any trouble with the law—until Wednesday.

A federal grand jury indicted him on charges of conspiracy to defraud the United States of Medicare funds, obstruction of justice and contempt of court.

Two years ago, Braxton, 62, represented Leonar Rodriguez in a civil case brought by the government, which alleged that several businesses operated by Rodriguez had illegally taken more than \$1 million from Medicare.

U.S. District Judge Ursula Ungaro-Benages froze all of Rodriguez's personal and corporate assets. But Braxton, over a period of six weeks after the court order, diverted more than \$103,000 in frozen Medicare and Medicaid funds into his attorney-client trust account, the government contends.

Later, the indictment alleges, Braxton funneled \$29,000 to his client, and took \$50,000 for legal

Miami attorney Donald Bierman, who graduated from the University of Miami School of Law with Braxton in 1965, is representing his former classmate. He said Braxton would plead not guilty today at a hearing before a
