Prudential Uniformed Services Administrators, Inc. ("PruUSA") is an Oklahoma domestic insurance company. PruUSA is ultimately a shell company organized under the laws of Oklahoma which maintained certificates of authority to transact insurance business in Arkansas, Florida, Georgia, Louisiana, Oklahoma and Texas. Although the company is or was licensed in each jurisdiction, it has no insurance business in force in Oklahoma, nor in any other state. It does not have, nor has it ever had, any policyholders or insureds of any kind. Indeed, PruUSA has not done business since its inception.

Pursuant to its bylaws and the laws of the State of Oklahoma, with the consent of all of the officers, directors and the sole shareholder thereof, PruUSA has elected to wind-up and dissolve based on the insurer's inactivity. It has initiated withdrawal proceedings in each of the aforementioned jurisdictions in which it holds non-resident licenses, as well as in its state of domicile, Oklahoma. Indeed, PruUSA has successfully, and completely, withdrawn from several of those jurisdictions. PruUSA has applied for and received a Certificate of Dissolution from the

Oklahoma Secretary of State (a copy of which is enclosed), and has contacted and forwarded same to the Oklahoma Department of Insurance.

On August 31, 2000, PruUSA provided the Florida Department of Insurance with the official notice required by Florida Statute, Section 624.430 of the insurer's desire to surrender its Certificate of Authority and withdraw from the business of insurance in the State of Florida (a copy of which is attached hereto). Therein, the company requested that its withdrawal be considered effective December 1, 2000 to ensure compliance with the 90-day notice requirement of Florida Statute, Section 624.430. On October 17, 2000, PruUSA received notice from George Albritton of the Florida Department of Insurance informing the insurer that its request for withdrawal was thereby accepted, and that the insurer's request for withdrawal was accepted, effective December 1, 2000 (a copy of which is also attached). Mr. Albritton further confirmed that PruUSA has never written any insurance in Florida, has no outstanding or pending claims or policy related liabilities in Florida and has no outstanding taxes or charges due in Florida.

In light of the foregoing, please allow this to serve as PruUSA's notice to the Florida Secretary of State of its intent to fully and completely withdraw from the Florida insurance marketplace. In connection therewith, please find enclosed the requisite Application By Foreign Corporation For Withdrawal Of Authority To Transact Business or Conduct Affairs in Florida, completed and signed by Doreen S. Faga, President of PruUSA. Also, please find attached a check in the amount of \$52.50, which includes the requisite \$35.00 processing fee plus an additional \$16.00 to cover the cost of a Certified Copy of the insurer's application and a Certificate of Status. Importantly, PruUSA hereby requests that its withdrawal application filed with the Secretary of State and accepted effective December 1, 2000 to avoid any violation of Florida's 90-day notice rule (and any violation of Fla. Admin. Code, Rule 4-141.020(5)).

At your earliest convenience, please advise as to what additional steps, if any, PruUSA must take in order to successfully complete its dissolution and withdrawal. Should you desire to market insurance in Florida in the future, please contact us for readmission procedures. We would be glad to assist you in that process.



This constitutes the notice required by Florida Statute. Section 624.430 (the "Statute"), of this insurer's desire to surrender its Certificate of Authority and withdrawal from the business of insurance in the State of Florida.

Prudential Uniformed Services Administrators. Inc. ("PruUSA") is an Oklahoma domestic insurance company. PruUSA is ultimately a shell company organized under the laws of Oklahoma which maintains certificates of authority to transact insurance business in Arkansas, Florida, Georgia, Louisiana, Oklahoma and Texas. Although the company is licensed in each jurisdiction, it has no insurance business in force in Oklahoma, nor in any other state. It does not have, nor has it ever had, any policyholders or insureds of any kind. Indeed, PruUSA has not done business since its inception.

Pursuant to its bylaws and the laws of the State of Oklahoma, with the consent of all of the officers, directors and the sole shareholder thereof, PruUSA has elected to wind-up and dissolve based on the insurer's inactivity. It has initiated withdrawal proceedings in each of the aforementioned jurisdictions in which it holds non-resident licenses, as well as in its state of domicile, Oklahoma. In connection therewith, PruUSA has applied for and received a Certificate of Dissolution from the Oklahoma Secretary of State (a copy of which is enclosed), and has contacted and forwarded same to the Oklahoma Department of Insurance. We understand that PruUSA must also notify the Florida Department of Insurance of its intent to withdrawal from the Florida insurance marketplace. Please allow this to serve as that notice. In accordance with the ninety (90) day notice requirement set

forth in the Statute. PruUSA requests that the effective date of its withdrawal from the State of Florida be December 1, 2000.

PruUSA must submit a withdrawal form to the Florida Secretary of State, but will wait on doing so until December 1, 2000 (to avoid violation of Fla. Admin. Code, Rule 4-141.020(5)). In the event that PruUSA's withdrawal is effected, the insurer's security deposit on file with the Department of Insurance may be returned to me at 290 West Mt. Pleasant Avenue, Mail Stop 11-01-89, Livingston, New Jersey, 07039-2747.

Unfortunately. PruUSA's original Certificate of Authority to transact the business of insurance in the State of Florida cannot be located. A diligent search for the Certificate has been executed, and it was determined that the Certificate was either lost or destroyed. Therefore, it is impossible to surrender the Certificate to the Department of Insurance. In its place, please find enclosed my sworn affidavit, attesting to that fact. It is our understanding, based upon a conversation with a representative of the Florida Department of Insurance, that such an affidavit will suffice in place of a lost or destroyed Certificate of Authority.

At your earliest convenience, please advise as to what additional steps PruUSA must take in order to successfully complete its dissolution and withdrawal.
