CERTIFICATE OF AMENDMENT TO ARTICLES OF ORGANIZATION OF DECORAMA DESLEY CORTLEY, LLC

A Florida Limited Liability Company

FIRST:

The date of filing of the articles of organization was May 31, 2002.

SECOND:

The following amendments to the articles of organization were adopted by the limited liability

company:

ARTICLE VI is hereby added to the articles of organization as follows:

RIGHT TO INDEMNIFICATION. The Company shall indemnify each Member to the fullest extent allowed by law from all claims brought by third parties relating to or arising out of the Company business. The Company shall indemnify and hold harmless Officers to the fullest extent permitted or authorized by the Act or future legislation or by current or future judicial or administrative decision (but, in the case of future legislation or decision, only to the extent that it permits the Company to provide broader indemnification rights than permitted prior to the legislation or decision), against all fines, liabilities, settlements, losses, damages, costs and expenses, including attorneys' fees, asserted against him or incurred by him in his capacity as an Officer or arising out of his status as an Officer. The foregoing right of indemnification shall not be exclusive of other rights to which those seeking indemnification may be entitled. The Company may maintain insurance, at its expense, to protect itself and the indemnified persons against all fines, liabilities, costs and expenses, including attorneys' fees, whether or not the Company would have the legal power to indemnify him directly against such liability.

ADVANCES. Costs, charges and expenses (including attorneys' fees) incurred by a person referred to in this Article (for purposes of this paragraph, a "Person") in defending a civil or criminal suit, action or proceeding shall be paid by the Company in advance of the final disposition thereof upon receipt from the Person (or such other person or entity approved by and at the sole discretion of the Company) of a written and binding obligation to repay all amounts advanced if it is ultimately determined that the Person is not entitled to be indemnified by the Company as authorized by this Article.

SAVINGS CLAUSE. If this Article VI or any portion hereof shall be invalidated on any ground by any court of competent jurisdiction, then the Company shall nevertheless indemnify and hold harmless each Member or any other person indemnified pursuant to this Article VI as to costs, charges and expenses (including attorneys' fees), judgments, fines and amounts paid in settlement with respect to any action, suit or proceeding, whether civil, criminal, administrative or investigative to the full extent permitted by any applicable portion of this Article VI that shall not have been invalidated and to the fullest extent permitted by applicable law.
