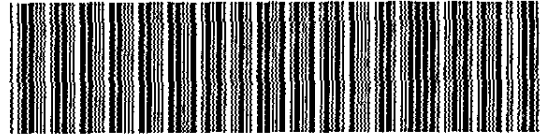

**ARTICLES OF ORGANIZATION  
OF  
BF1, LLC**

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TALLAHASSEE, FLORIDA

Article I. Name.

The name of this limited liability company shall be **BF1, LLC**.

Article II. Duration.

This company shall commence its existence on the date of execution and acknowledgment of these Articles of Organization, and shall exist for a period of twenty-nine (29) years.

Article III. Principal Office and Mailing Address.

The mailing address and street address of the principal office of the company is 820 SW 12<sup>th</sup> Street, Pompano Beach, FL 33069.

Article IV. Initial Registered Office and Agent.

The name and street address of the company's initial registered agent is LEE MILICH, ESQUIRE, 100 West Cypress Creek Road, Suite 935, Ft. Lauderdale, FL 33309.

Article V. Admission of Additional Members.

The company shall have the right to admit additional members upon a vote of the majority of the members.

Article VI. Termination.

Upon the death, retirement, resignation, or incapacity of GERALD BRAUSER, the company shall be terminated.

Article VII. Managing Members.

Make contracts or guarantees, or incur liabilities; borrow money; issue its notes, bonds, or other obligations; secure any of its obligations by mortgage or pledge of all or any part of its property, franchises, and income; or make contracts of guaranty and suretyship which are necessary or convenient to the conduct, promotion, or attainment of the business of a corporation, the majority of the outstanding stock of which is owned, directly or indirectly, by the contracting company; a corporation which owns, directly or indirectly, a majority of the outstanding stock of the contracting company; or a corporation, the majority of the outstanding stock of which is owned, directly or indirectly, by a corporation which owns, directly or indirectly, the majority of the outstanding stock of the contracting company, which contracts of guaranty and suretyship shall be deemed to be necessary or convenient to the conduct, promotion, or attainment of the business of the contracting company; or make other contracts of guaranty and suretyship which are necessary or convenient to the conduct, promotion, or attainment of the business of the contracting company.
5. Lend money, invest or reinvest its funds, or receive and hold real or personal property as security for repayment.
6. Conduct its business, locate offices, and exercise the powers granted by Chapter 608, Fla. Stat., within or without the State of Florida.

16. Make payments or donations or do any other act not inconsistent with law that furthers the business and affairs of the company.


