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# ARTICLES OF ORGANIZATION OF LAS OLAS PLACE PROPERTIES, LLC

# Article I. Name.

The name of this limited liability company shall be LAS OLAS PLACE PROPERTIES, LLC.

Article II. Duration.

Members' interests in the company shall be evidenced by a limited liability membership certificate according to the provisions herein.

# Article VII. Indemnification.

The company shall indemnify the managing members with respect to any acts committed by them on behalf of the company as provided in § 608.4363, Fla. Stat.

## Article VIII. Powers.

The company shall have the same powers as an individual to do all things necessary to carry out its business and affairs, including, without limitation, the power to:
