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ARTICLES OF ORGANIZATION OF 1700 BUILDING, L.L.C.

The undersigned certify that we have associated ourselves together for the purpose of becoming a limited liability company under the laws of the State of Florida, providing for the formation, rights, privileges, and immunities of limited liability companies for profit. We further declare that the following Articles shall serve as the Charter and authority for the conduct of business of the limited liability company.

Article I Name and Principal Place of Business

Name and Principal Place of Business. The name of the limited liability company shall be 1700 Building, L.L.C., and its principal office and mailing address shall be located at 5300 North Federal Highway, Fort Lauderdale, Florida 33308, and it shall have the power and authority to establish branch offices at any other place or places as the members may designate.

Article II Purposes and Powers

In addition to the powers authorized by the laws of the State of Florida for limited liability companies, the general nature of the business or businesses to be transacted, and which the limited liability company is authorized to transact, shall be as follows:

- 'a. To engage in any activity or business authorized under the Florida Statutes which relates to the acquisition, development, and sale of real estate, specifically that commercial property located at 1700 University Drive, Coral Springs, Florida.
- b. In general, to carry on any and all incidental business; to have and exercise all the powers conferred by the laws of the State of Florida, and to do any and all things set forth in these Articles to the same extent as a natural person might or could do insofar as it relates to the acquisition, management or sale of real property.
- c. To purchase or otherwise acquire, undertake, carry on, improve, or develop, and/or sell all or any of the business, good will, rights, assets, and liabilities of any person, firm, association, or corporation carrying on any kind of business of a similar nature to that which this limited liability company is authorized to carry on, pursuant to the provisions of these Articles; and to hold, utilize, and in any manner dispose of the rights and property so acquired.
- d. To enter into and make all necessary contracts for its business with any person, entity, partnership, association, corporation, domestic or foreign, or of any domestic or foreign state, government, or governmental authority, or of any political or administrative subdivision, or department, and to perform and carry out, assign, cancel, or rescind any of such contracts, insofar as it relates to the acquisition, management or sale of real property.
- e. To exercise all or any of the limited liability company powers, and to carry out all or any of the purposes, enumerated in these Articles and otherwise granted or permitted by law, while acting as agent, nominee, or attorney-in-fact for any persons or corporations, and perform any service under contract or otherwise for

any corporation, joint stock company, association, partnership, firm, syndicate, individual, or other entity, and in this capacity or under this arrangement develop, improve, stabilize, strengthen, or extend the property and commercial interest of the property and to aid, assist, or participate in any lawful enterprise in connection with or incidental to the agency, representation, or service, and to render any other service or assistance it may lawfully do under the laws of the State of Florida, providing for the formation, rights, privileges, and immunities of limited liability companies for profit.

f. To do anything necessary, proper, advisable, or convenient for the accomplishment of any of the purposes, or the attainment of any of the objects, or the furtherance of any of the powers set forth in these Articles, either alone or in association with others incidental or pertaining to, or going out of, or connected with its business or powers, provided the same shall not be inconsistent with the laws of the State of Florida.

The several clauses contained in this statement of the general nature of the business or businesses to be transacted shall be construed as both purposes and powers of this limited liability company, and statements contained in each clause shall, except as otherwise expressed, be in no way limited or restricted by reference to or inference from the terms of any other clause. They shall be regarded as independent purposes and powers.

Nothing contained in these Articles shall be deemed or construed as authorizing or permitting or purporting to authorize or permit the limited liability company to carry

on any business, exercise any power, or do any act which a limited liability company may not, under Florida laws, lawfully carry on, exercise, or do.

Article III Exercise of Powers

All limited liability company powers shall be exercised by or under the authority of, and the business and affairs of this limited liability company shall be managed under the direction of, the members of this limited liability company. Unless otherwise specified, all decisions shall be by majority vote based upon the percentage interests of the members. This is a member-managed limited liability company. This Article may be amended from time to time in the regulations of the limited liability company by a unanimous vote of the members of the limited liability company.

Article IV Management

Management of this limited liability company is reserved to its members, whose names and addresses are as follows:

The members shall have the right to select a property management company to manage any real estate acquired by this limited liability company. The managing members of this limited liability company shall be George W. Weaver and Jefferson H. Weaver.

Article V Membership Restrictions

Members shall have the right to admit new members by unanimous consent.

Contributions required of new members shall be determined as of the time of admission to the limited liability company.

A member's interest in the limited liability company may not be sold or otherwise transferred without the unanimous written consent of all members. The remaining (non-selling) members shall have a right of first refusal to match the bona fide offer of any third party desiring to purchase the selling member's interest. In the absence of a third party offer, the selling member and the remaining members may determine the value of the selling member's interest by appraisal—net of liabilities, said appraisal to be performed by an MAI designated appraiser active in Broward County, Florida. Any such acquisition of the selling member's interest by the remaining members shall be on a prorata basis based upon the respective percentage interests of the remaining members in this limited liability company.

On the death, retirement, resignation, expulsion, bankruptcy, or dissolution of a member, or the occurrence of any other event that terminates the continued membership of a member in the limited liability company, the remaining members shall have the right to continue the business on unanimous consent of the remaining members.

Article VI Capital Contributions

Capital contributions, if any, shall be paid to the limited liability company by the three members in such shares as to create the following ownership interests: George W. Weaver 47.785%, Jefferson H. Weaver, Trustee 47.785%, William F. Koch, Jr., 4.43% Additional contributions will be made as required for investment purposes, as determined by unanimous consent of the members. Members will make contributions in shares proportionate to their ownership interests in the limited liability company as specified in this Article VI.

Article VII Profits and Losses

a. Profit Sharing. The members shall be entitled pro-rata to the net profits arising from the operation of the limited liability company business that remains after the payment of the expenses of conducting the business of the limited liability company including but not limited to any fees, costs, or expenses relating to the acquisition, refurbishment, repair, management or sale of any real property as well as any closing costs. In addition, reserves may be established when necessary for such items including but not limited to roof replacement and air conditioning replacement. Each member shall be entitled to a distributive share of the profits in proportion with his interest in Article VI. The distributive share of the profits shall be determined and paid to the members on the anniversary date of the commencement of business of the limited liability company.

b. Losses. All losses that occur in the operation of the limited liability company business shall be paid out of the capital of the limited liability company and the profits of the business or, if these sources are insufficient to cover such losses, by the members in proportion to each member's interest as specified in Article VI.

Article VIII Duration

This limited liability company shall exist until January 1, 2023 or until dissolved in a manner provided by law, or as provided in the regulations adopted by the members.
