ARTICLE I NAME: APPLICABLE LAW

The name of the limited liability company formed pursuant to the filing of these Articles of Organization (the "Articles") is "The Chapel Nona, LLC" (the "Company"). The Company is created pursuant to and in accordance with the Florida Revised Limited Liability Company Act, Chapter 605, Florida Statutes (as amended from time to time, the "LLC Act"). The Company and its internal affairs shall be governed by the LLC Act and the laws of the State of Florida.

ARTICLE IV MANAGEMENT

The Company shall be a manager-managed limited liability company within the meaning of the LLC Act and shall be governed by a written operating agreement entered into between and among its members as amended from time to time, the "Operating Agreement"). The Operating Agreement may not be amended except as expressly provided in the Operating Agreement. The number of managers ("Managers") shall be determined as provided in the Operating Agreement and the Managers shall have the powers, duties and authority set forth in the LLC Act, subject to any express limitations contained in the Operating Agreement. The Managers shall be elected, removed and replaced from time to time in accordance with the Operating Agreement. The names and addresses of the initial Managers of the Company are as follows:

ARTICLE V EFFECTIVE DATE

The effective date of these Articles shall be the date on which they are accepted for filing by the Florida Department of State.

ARTICLE VI RESTRICTIONS ON TRANSFER; ADMISSION OF ADDITIONAL OR SUBSTITUTE MEMBERS

Among other things, the Operating Agreement restricts the sale, transfer, pledge, hypothecation, exchange, assignment or other disposition by any means, including but not limited to those which are voluntary, involuntary, by operation of law, by the laws of descent and distribution, or otherwise (each, a "Transfer"), of the limited liability company membership interests in the Company. Any such Transfer shall be void ab initio unless made in strict compliance with the terms and conditions of the Operating Agreement. In addition, no person or entity shall be admitted as a member of the Company, whether in substitution for another member or as an additional member, except in accordance with the Operating Agreement.

ARTICLE VII AMENDMENTS

These Articles may not be amended except as provided in the Operating Agreement.
