


Thank you for sending me the reinstatement application.

To reiterate, I filed my 1999 corporate report then moved to Pompano on September 1, 1999. I never received a renewal notice though my mail was forwarded. In the course of remodeling, and reestablishing my home I didn't realize that I didn't receive a renewal. In 2000, when things were more settled, I didn't receive a renewal so my accountant provided me with one and I submitted a check along with the renewal. I never heard a response so I assumed all was well. In August I noticed that the check that was written in March was not cashed nor returned. It was only when I inquired about the check that I was told that the corporation was dissolved. The response to the renewal was sent AGAIN to my old address, even though the correct address was written on the renewal. I had no clue as to the situation.
