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ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION FOR TAMPA STREET SCHOOL, INC.

The undersigned, acting as incorporator of a corporation pursuant to Chapter 617, Florida Statutes, adopts the following Articles of Incorporation:

ARTICLE I: NAME

The name of the corporation shall be: Tampa Street School, Inc.

ARTICLE II: PRINCIPAL ADDRESS

The principal address of the corporation shall be:

4532 W. Kennedy Blvd #148 TAMPA, FL 33609

ARTICLE III: PURPOSE

The purposes for which the Corporation is organized are as follows:

- A. To create such organizations, boards, or groups of individuals to conduct such legal activities as may be In keeping with teaching, promoting, encouraging, supporting, or guidance in the principles of the Christian faith through the belief in Jesus Christ our Lord.
- B. To organize and assemble the necessary employees, facilities, materials and programs to minister in accordance with the stated purpose in paragraph A.
- C. The purpose of the Tampa Street School is to facilitate a successful learning experience for the segment of society whose education has been disrupted by personal and environmental deficits. Tuition will be assessed on an "as able" basis. However, every student will be required to pay a modest sum as an expression of his or her commitment to this educational process.
- D. To receive contributions and pay them over to organizations that are described in section 501[C][3] and exempt under section 501[A] of the Internal Revenue Service Code.

ARTICLE IV: DIRECTORS

The corporation shall have three directors initially. The number of directors may be increased or decreased from time to time as delineated in the By-Laws of the corporation, provided that the corporation shall always have at least three directors. ARTICLE IX: AMENDMENTS

These Articles of Incorporation may be amended in the manner provided by law.

ARTICLE X: ACTIVITIES AND INCOME DISTRIBUTION

No part of the net earnings of the corporation shall inure to the benefit of, or be distributed to, its members, directors, officers, or other private persons, except that the corporation shall be authorized and empowered to pay reasonable compensation for services rendered and to make payments and distributions in furtherance of the purposes set forth in Article III hereof. No substantial part of the activities of the corporation shall be the carrying on of propaganda, or otherwise attempting to influence legislation and the corporation shall not participate in [including the publishing or distribution of statements] any political campaign on behalf of any candidate for public office. Notwithstanding any other provisions of these Articles, the corporation shall not carry on any other activities not permitted to be carried on by [A] a corporation exempt from federal income tax under section 501[C][3] of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954 [or the corresponding provision of any future United States Internal Revenue Law] or [B] by a corporation, contributions to which are deductible under section 170[C][2] of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954 [or the corresponding provision of any future United States Internal Revenue Law].

ARTICLE XI: DISTRIBUTION OF ASSETS UPON DISSOLUTION

Upon the dissolutions of the corporation, the Board of Directors shall, after paying or making provision for the payment of all of the liabilities of the corporation, dispose of all the assets of the corporation exclusively for the purposes of the corporation in such manner, or to such organization or organizations organized and operated exclusively for charitable, educational, religious or scientific purposes as shall at the time qualify as an exempt organization or organizations under section 501[C][3] of the Internal Revenue Service Code of 1954 [or the corresponding provision of any future United States Internal Revenue Law], as the Board of Directors shall determine. Any such asset not so disposed of shall be turned over to the District Court of the County in which the principal office of the Organization is then located, exclusively for such purposes or to such organization or organizations as the Court shall determine, which are organized and operated exclusively for such purposes.
