ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

THE UNDERSIGNED, desiring to form a Corporation not-for-profit pursuant to Chapter 617 of the Florida Statute, the Florida Not-for Profit Corporation Act ("Act"), as amended, hereby adopts the following Articles of Incorporation for such Corporation:

ARTICLE I

The name of the Corporation shall be the LENORE R. BLAND and SYDNEY F. BLAND CHARITABLE FOUNDATION, INC., which is hereinafter referred to as the "Foundation".

ARTICLE II Principal Office

The address of the principal office of the Foundation is c/o Barash & Associates, P.A., 1140 Kane Concourse, Bay Harbor Islands, Florida 33154.

ARTICLE III Period of Duration

The period of the duration of this Foundation is perpetual unless dissolved according to law.

ARTICLE IV Purposes, Powers and Limitations

Section 1. Purposes.

(a) The Foundation is organized exclusively for charitable, religious, scientific, educational and literary purposes within the meaning of Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, or corresponding provisions of

any future United States Internal Revenue Law (hereinafter the "Code").

- (b) The specific purpose of the Foundation is to receive, hold, invest and manage contributions to the Foundation and, subject to the restrictions and limitations hereinafter set forth, to use and apply such contributions exclusively to promote the purposes set forth above by annually distributing the "minimum investment return" (as defined by the Code) of the Foundation among such charities qualified to receive contributions under subsection (a) above including but not limited to the following:
 - (1) American Cancer Society Atlanta, Georgia
 - (2) American Heart Association Dallas, Texas
 - (3) Miami Heart Research Institute Miami Beach, Florida
 - (4) American National Red Cross Arlington, Virginia
 - (5) American Red Magen David for Israel Hallandale Bch, FL
 - (6) Salvation Army Atlanta, Georgia
 - (7) Lymphatic Research Foundation, Inc. Roslyn, New York
 - (8) United Cerebral Palsy Association of Miami Miami, FL

Section 2. Powers.

The Foundation's purposes as herein stated shall be carried out by its Board of Directors in a manner that will enable the Foundation to qualify as a charitable organization within the meaning of Section 501(c)(3) of the Code. To this end the Foundation shall have the following powers:

- (a) To own, acquire, convey, exchange, lease, mortgage, encumber, transfer in trust, or otherwise dispose of, all property, real or personal; to borrow money, contract debts, and issue bonds, notes and debentures, and to secure the payment or performance of its obligations.
- (b) To receive property by gift, devise or bequest subject to the laws regulating the transfer of property by will, and otherwise to acquire and hold all property, real or personal, including shares of stock, bonds and securities of other corporations.
- (c) To enter into contracts with any person, firm, association, corporation, municipality, county, state, nation or other body politic or with any colony, dependency or agency of any of the foregoing.

(d) To perform every act necessary or proper for the accomplishment of the objects and purposes enumerated or for the protection and benefit of the Foundation.

Section 3. Limitations.

Notwithstanding any powers granted to this Foundation by its Articles, By-Laws of by the laws of the State of Florida, the following limitations of powers shall apply and be paramount:

- (a) No part of the net earnings of the Foundation shall inure in whole or in part to the benefit of any member, director, or officer of the Foundation; or, to any private individual (except that reasonable compensation may be paid for services rendered to or for the Foundation relating to one or more of its purposes; and, except to the extent that such benefit inures to persons in accordance with the carrying out of the Foundation's charitable purposes, no member, director or officer of the Foundation, or any private individual shall be entitled to share in the distribution of any of the corporate assets on dissolution of the Foundation.
- (b) No substantial part of the activities of the Foundation shall be the carrying on of propaganda, or otherwise attempting to influence legislation, except to the extent permitted by the Code, and which is directly related to the Foundation's charitable purposes.
- (c) The Foundation shall neither participate in or intervene in, nor publish or distribute statements on behalf of, or in opposition to, any candidate for public office.
- (d) Notwithstanding any other provisions of these articles of incorporation, the Foundation shall not conduct or carry on any activities not permitted to be conducted or carried on by an organization exempt under Section 501(c)(3) of the Code or by an organization, contributions to which are deductible under Sections 170(a), 2522(a) or 2055(a) of the Code.
- (e) Upon the dissolution of the Foundation, the Board of Directors of the Foundation shall, after paying or making provision for the payment of all of the liabilities of the Foundation, distribute all residual assets of the Foundation to such charitable organization or organizations which would then qualify under the provisions of Sections 501(c)(3) and 170(c)(2) of the Code or corresponding sections of any future Internal Revenue Code; or, to

one or more of the federal, state or local governments for exclusively public purposes as the Board of Directors shall consider most nearly meets the obligations and purposes of the Foundation. Any assets not so disposed of shall be disposed of by a court of competent jurisdiction exclusively for charitable purposes, or to such organization or organizations organized and operated exclusively for such charitable purposes, as said court shall determine.

ARTICLE V Private Foundation Rules

- If the Foundation is determined to be a Private Foundation within the meaning of Section 509 of the Code, and is not an Operating Foundation as defined in Section 4942(j)(3) of the Code, then the following provisions of this Article V shall apply:
- (a) The Foundation shall distribute its income for each tax year at such time and in such manner as not to become subject to the tax on undistributed income imposed by Section 4942 of the Code, or corresponding provisions of any later federal tax laws.
- (b) The Foundation shall not engage in any act of self-dealing as defined in Section 4941(d) of the Code, or corresponding provisions of any later federal tax laws.
- (c) The Foundation shall not retain any excess business holdings as defined in Section 4943(c) of the Code, or corresponding provisions of any later federal tax laws.
- (d) The Foundation shall not make any investments in _____ such manner as to subject it to tax under Section 4944 of the Code, ____ or corresponding provisions of any later federal tax laws.
- (e) The Foundation shall not make any taxable expenditures as defined in Section 4945(d) of the Code, or corresponding provisions of any later federal tax laws.

ARTICLE VI

Qualification and Manner of Admission of Members

The Foundation shall have one (1) class of Members. Each Director on the Board of Directors of the Foundation shall be a MEMBER of the Foundation. Each MEMBER shall be entitled to one

vote. Upon taking office as a Director of the Foundation, admission as a member shall be automatic. The By-Laws of the Foundation shall govern all other matters concerning membership in the Foundation.

ARTICLE VII Board of Directors

- 1. The affairs and business of the Foundation shall be conducted by its Board of Directors as may be more fully discussed in the By-Laws of the Foundation.
- 2. The Board of Directors shall consist of not less than three (3) nor more than fifteen (15) persons.

4. In the event of a vacancy on the Board of Directors by reason of death, incapacity, resignation or removal, the replacement Director shall be elected in accordance with the By-Laws of the Foundation.

ARTICLE VIII Officers

1. The Foundation shall have a president, one or more vice-presidents, a secretary, a treasurer and such other officers and/or assistants as the Board of Directors may, from time to time, elect.

- 2. The officers of the Foundation, in accordance with any applicable provisions of the By-Laws, shall be elected by the Board of Directors for terms of one (1) year or until qualified successors are duly elected and have taken office. The By-Laws may provide for the method of voting in the election, for the removal from office of officers, for filling vacancies and for the duties of the officers. If any office shall become vacant for any reason, the Board of Directors may elect or appoint an individual to fill such vacancy.
- 3. The names and addresses of the initial officers of the Foundation who shall hold office until the annual meeting of Directors or until successors are duly elected and shall have taken office shall be as follows:

ARTICLE IX By-Laws

The Board of Directors shall adopt By-Laws consistent with these Articles of Incorporation. Except as otherwise provided in these Articles of Incorporation, such By-Laws may be altered, amended or repealed by the Board of Directors.

ARTICLE X Amendments

Except as otherwise provided in these Articles of Incorporations, amendments to these Articles of Incorporation may be adopted only by the Board of Directors pursuant to notice of a meeting whether annual or special, for such purpose. Except as

otherwise provided in these Articles of Incorporation, any such amendment must be approved by not less than two-thirds (2/3) of those voting at a meeting at which a quorum is present. Any amendment to these Articles of Incorporation must not adversely affect the status of the Foundation as an organization described in Section 501(c)(3) of the Code.

ARTICLE XI

Indemnification of Directors and Officers, Employees and Agents

- (a) The Foundation hereby indemnifies against liability any person who was or is a party to any proceeding (other than an action by, or in the right of, the Foundation),
- (i) by reason of the fact that such person in his or her capacity as Director, officer, employee or agent of the Foundation, or such person in his or her capacity as director, trustee, officer, employee or agent of any other corporation, partnership, joint venture, trust or other enterprise which he or she served at the request of the Foundation in connection with such proceeding, including any appeal thereof, if such person acted in good faith in the reasonable belief that such action was in the best interests of the Foundation and with respect to any criminal actions or proceedings, had no reasonable ground for belief that such action was unlawful. The termination of any proceeding by judgment, order, settlement, conviction or upon a plea of nolo contendere or its equivalent shall not in itself create a presumption that any such person did not act in good faith in the reasonable belief that such action was in the best interests of the Foundation or that he or she had reasonable grounds for belief that such action was unlawful.
- (ii) by or in the right of the Foundation to procure a judgment in its favor by reason of such person being or having been a Director or officer, employee or agent of the Foundation, or by reason of such person being or having been a director, officer, employee or agent of any other corporation, partnership, joint venture, trust or other enterprise which such person served at the request of the Foundation, against the reasonable expenses, and amounts paid in settlement not exceeding, in the judgment of the Board of Directors, the estimated expense of litigating the proceeding to conclusion actually and reasonably incurred in connection with the defense or settlement of such proceeding, or in connection with an appeal therein, if such person acted in good faith in the reasonable belief that such action was in the best

interests of the Foundation. Such person shall not be entitled to indemnification in relation to matters as to which such person has been adjudged liable unless and only to the extent that the court, in which such proceeding was brought, or any other court of competent jurisdiction, determines in view of all circumstances of the case, such person is fairly and reasonably entitled to indemnification for such expenses which such court shall deem proper.

- discretion to determine whether amounts for which a Director or officer seeks indemnification were properly incurred and whether such Director or officer acted in good faith and in a manner he or she reasonably believed to be in the best interests of the Foundation, and whether, with respect to any criminal action or proceeding, he or she had no reasonable ground for belief that such action was unlawful. Such determination shall be made by the Board of Directors by a majority vote of a quorum consisting of Directors who were not parties to such proceeding. If such a quorum is not obtainable, such determination shall be made by majority vote of a committee duly designated by the Board of Directors (Directors who are parties may participate) consisting solely of two or more Directors not parties to such proceeding.
- (c) The foregoing rights of indemnification shall not be deemed to limit in any way the powers of the Foundation to indemnify under applicable law.

ARTICLE XII <u>Initial Registered Office and Agent</u>

The street address of the initial registered office of the Foundation shall be c/o Barash & Associates, P.A.,1140 Kane Concourse, Bay Harbor Islands, Florida 33154 and the name of its registered agent at such address is A. Jeffrey Barash, Esq.

ARTICLE XIII Incorporator
