

### ARTICLES OF DISSOLUTION

## AT THE WELL CHURCH, INC.

Pursuant to the provisions of section 617 of the Florida Statutes, 2002, as amended, "Nonprofit Corporation Act," the undersigned corporation adopts the following articles of dissolution for the purpose of dissolving the corporation:

First:

The name of the corporation is AT THE WELL CHURCH, INC.

Second:

A resolution to dissolve the corporation was adopted in the following manner:

The resolution to dissolve the corporation was adopted at a meeting of the board of directors held on Monday, October 21, 2002, and received the vote of a majority of the directors in office, there being no members entitled to vote in respect thereof.

Third: No plan of distribution was adopted by the corporation.

Fourth: All debts, obligations and liabilities of the corporation have been paid and discharged, or adequate provisions have been made thereof.

Fifth: All remaining property and assets of the corporation have been transferred, conveyed or distributed in accordance with the provisions of the Florida Nonprofit Corporation Act.

Sixth: There are no suits pending against the corporation in any court in respect of which adequate provision has not been made for the satisfaction of any judgment, order or decree that may be entered against it.
