Articles of Amendment

To Articles of Incorporation

Of South Asia Against AIDS Foundation, Inc.

Pursuant to the provisions of section 617.1006, Florida Statutes, the undersigned Florida non-profit corporation adopts the following Articles of Amendment to its Articles of Incorporation.

Amendment Adopted: Article One

The name of the corporation/organization is:

South Asia Against AIDS Foundation, Inc.

Amendment Adopted: Article Two

Amendment Adopted: Article Three

This corporation/organization is organized and operated exclusively for charitable, educational, religious or scientific purposes, within the meaning of section 501 (c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code (or corresponding section of any future federal tax code), including, for such purposes, the making of distributions to organizations that qualify as exempt organizations under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code (or corresponding section of any future federal tax code).

This corporation/organization is organized for lawful purpose or purposes and not for pecuniary profit. This corporation/organization is organized and operated to raise public awareness and resources for the fight against HIV/AIDS in South Asia. It's mission is: "One day, all people shall be able to protect themselves against the virus that causes AIDS and live productive lives should they be HIV-positive."

Amendment Adopted: Article Four

The manner is which the Officers of the corporation's/organization's Governing Board of Directors are elected or appointed is as follows:

This corporation/organization shall have three Officers constituting the Governing Board. The number of Officers may be either increased or decreased from time to time by the bylaws. However, there shall never be fewer than three Officers of the Governing Board or more than five Officers of the Governing Board. There shall be a maximum of 30 Directors on the Board of Directors, including the presence of the Officers of the Governing Board. Officers and Directors shall be elected and appointed in the manner and for the terms provided in the bylaws.

The period of duration of this corporation is perpetual.

Amendment Adopted: Article Eight

The corporation/organization does not have any membership dues.

Amendment Adopted: Article Nine

No part of the net earnings of the corporation/organization shall inure to the benefit of, or be distributable to, its Trustees, Officers, Directors, or other private persons, except that the corporation/organization shall be authorized and empowered to pay reasonable compensation for services rendered and to make payments and distributions in furtherance of section 501(c)(3) purposes.

No substantial part of the activities of the corporation/organization shall be the carrying on of propaganda, or otherwise attempting to influence legislation, and the corporation/organization shall not participate in, or intervene in (including the publishing or distribution of statements) any political campaign on behalf of or in opposition to any candidate for public office.

Notwithstanding any other provision of these articles, the corporation/organization shall not carry on any other activities not permitted to be carried on (a) by a corporation/organization exempt from federal income tax under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code (or corresponding section of any future federal tax code) or (b) by a corporation/organization, contributions to which are deductible under section 170(c)(2) of the Internal Revenue Code (or corresponding section of any future Federal tax code).

Upon dissolution of this corporation/organization, assets shall be distributed for one or more exempt purposes within the meaning of section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, i.e., charitable, educational, religious or scientific, or corresponding section of any future federal tax code, or shall be distributed to the federal government, or to a state or local government for a public purpose.

However, if the named recipient is not then in existence or no longer a qualified distributee, or unwilling or unable to accept the distribution, then the assets of this corporation/organization shall be distributed to a fund, foundation or corporation organized and operated exclusively for the purposes specified in section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code (or corresponding section of any future federal tax code).

In any taxable year in which this corporation/organization is a private foundation as described in section 509(a) of the Internal Revenue Code, the corporation (1) shall distribute its income for said period at such time and manner as not to subject it to tax under section 4942 of the Internal Revenue Code; (2) shall not engage in any act of self-dealing as defined in section 4941(d) of the Internal Revenue Code; (3) shall not retain any excess business holdings as defined in section 4943(c) of the Internal Revenue Code; (4) shall not make investments in such manner as to subject the corporation to tax under section 4944 of the Internal Revenue Code; and (5) shall not make any taxable expenditures as defined in section 4945(d) of the Internal Revenue Code.
