ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION



ODOCT I, ED TALLAHASSEE, FLORIDA

HAITIAN CULTURE PRESERVATION, INC.

The undersigned, for the purpose of forming a nonprofit corporation under Florida Statutes Chapter 617, do hereby make and adopt the following Articles of Incorporation:

ARTICLE I. CORPORATE NAME.

The name of this corporation is Haitian Culture Preservation, Inc.

ARTICLE II. PRINCIPAL OFFICE.

The principal place of business and mailing address of this corporation are 2580 NW 47th Avenue, Lauderhill, FL 33313.

ARTICLE III. NOT FOR PROFIT.

The Corporation is a nonprofit corporation under the laws of the State of Florida.

The corporation is not formed for pecuniary profit. No part of the income or assets of the Corporation is distributable to or for the benefit of its Members, Trustees or Officers, Excepts to the extent permissible under law.

IV. DURATION

The duration of the Corporation is Perpetual.

V. PURPOSES

The Corporation is organized, and shall be operated exclusively for the following charitable, cultural and educational purposes:

- A. To establish and operate a charitable, cultural and educational organization for the advancement of the Haitian community in South Florida.
- B. To exercise all rights and powers conferred by the laws of the State of Florida upon nonprofit corporations, including without limiting the generality of the foregoing, to acquire by bequest, devise, gift, purchase, lease or otherwise any property of any sort or nature without limitation as to its amount or value, and to hold, invest, reinvest, manage, use, apply, employ, sell, expend, disburse, lease, mortgage, convey, option, donate or otherwise dispose of such property and the income, principal and proceeds of such property, for any of the purposes set forth herein.

To do such other things as are incidental to the purposes of the Corporation or necessary or desirable in order to accomplish them.

- C. To preserve the Haitian cultural heritage
- D. To educate the public on the rich artistic heritage of Haiti and the Haitian-American community of South Florida.
- E. All of the foregoing purposes shall be exercised exclusively charitable and educational purposes in such a manner that the Corporation will qualify as an exempt organization under section 501(c)(3) of the internal Revenue Code of 1986 or the corresponding provision of any future United States Internal Revenue Law.

VI. LIMITATION

No part of the net earning of the corporation shall inurte to the benefit of or be distributable to its Members, Trustees or Officers, but the Corporation shall be authorized and empowered to pay reasonable compensation for services rendered and to make payments and distributions in furtherance of the purposes set in Article 5 hereof.

VII. MEMBERS

The corporation shall have Voting Members who shall be elected by the Voting Members and shall have all the rights and privileges of Members of the Corporation. The Bylaws may provide for Nonvoting Members of one or more classes, who shall be admitted in such manner and who shall have such rights and privileges as set forth in the Bylaws, but who shall not have the right to vote.

ARTICLE VIII. INITIAL REGISTERED AGENT AND OFFICE.

The name and address of the initial registered agent are Rene Yacinthe at 2850 NW 47th Avenue, Fort-Lauderdale, FL 33313.

ARTICLE IX. INCORPORATORS.

The names and street addresses of the incorporators to these articles of incorporation are: Rene Yacinthe at 2850 NW 47th Avenue, Fort-Lauderdale, FL 33313; Yvon Andre 11351 SW 153rd Street, Miami, Florida 33157.

ARTICLE X. INITIAL BOARD OF TRUSTEES

The management of the Corporation shall be vested in a Board of Trustees. The number of Trustees constituting the initial Board of Trustees is 3. The number of Trustees may be increased or decreased from time to time in accordance with the Bylaws, but shall never be less than three. The voting Members shall elect the Trustees annually. The bylaws may provide for ex officio and honorary Trustees, and their rights and privileges, the name and address of each initial Trustee of the Corporation is as follow:

ARTICLE XI. OFFICERS

The Officers of the Corporation shall consist of a President, vice-president, Secretary, and a Treasurer. Each officer shall be elected by the Board of Trustee's and may be removed by the Board of Trustee at such time and in such manner as may be prescribed by the Bylaws. The names and addresses of the initial officers are as follow:

ARTICLE XII. BYLAWS

The Bylaws of the Corporation are to be made and adopted by the Board of Trustees, and may be altered, amended or rescinded by the Board of Trustees.

ARTICLE XIII. AMENDMENT

The Corporation reserves the right to mend or repeal any provisions contained in these Articles of Incorporation or any amendment to them, and all rights and privileges conferred upon the Members, trustees and Officers are subjected to this reservation. The Articles of Incorporation may be amended in Accordance with the provisions of the laws of the State of Florida, as amended from time to time, unless more specific provisions for amendments are adopted by the Corporation pursuant to Law.

ARTICLES. XIV

In the event of dissolution, the residual assets of the organization will be turned over to one or more organizations which themselves are exempt as organizations described in section 501(c)(3) and 170(c)(2) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954 or corresponding sections of any prior or future law, or to the Federal, State, or Local Government for exclusive public purpose.

ARTICLE XV. NON-STOCK BASIS

This Corporation is organized under a non-stock basis.
