ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION OF

HOLY OF HOLIES DELIVERANCE MINISTRY, INC. FILED

(A Not-for-Profit Corporation)

The undersigned, with other persons being desirous of forming a corporation net for SEE, FLORIDA profit under the provisions of Chapter 617 of the Florida Statutes, agree to the following:

ARTICLE I - NAME

The name of the corporation is HOLY OF HOLIES DELIVERANCE MINISTRY, INC.

ARTICLE II - ADDRESS

The address of the principal office is 20612 S.W. 122nd Avenue, Miami, Florida 33177, with a mailing address of P.O. Box 924137, Homestead, Florida 33092-4137.

ARTICLE III - PURPOSE

This corporation is organized exclusively for charitable, educational and other purposes within the scope of Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 (the "Internal Revenue Code"), including but not limited to the following conditions of the total man that this ministry will be focusing on to help bring about deliverance from, assistance with the recovery from, prevention from, and intervention in the areas of:

- a. Child Care:
- b. Education (Adult/Child);
- c. Spousal Abuse;
- d. Counseling;
- e. Drug Addiction;
- f. Alcoholism;
- g. Feeding the Hungry;
- h. Clothing;
- i. Homeless;
- j. Child Abuse/Molestation; and
- k. Other areas of Criminal Activity.

ARTICLE IV - LIMITATIONS ON ACTIVITIES

Section 4.1 No part of the net earnings of the corporation shall inure to the benefit of, or be distributable to any director, trustee or officer of the corporation or any member of the corporation or any other private individual (except that reasonable compensation may be paid for

services rendered to or for the corporation affecting one or more of its purposes), and no director or officer of this corporation, or any private individual shall be entitled to share in the distribution of any of the corporate assets on dissolution of the corporation. No substantial part of the activities of the corporation shall influence legislation, and the corporation shall not participate in or intervene in (including the publication or distribution of statements) any political campaign on behalf of any candidate to public office.

Section 4.2 The corporation shall distribute its income for each taxable year at such time and in such manner as not to become subject to tax on undistributed income imposed by Section 4952 of the Internal Revenue Code, or corresponding provisions of any subsequent federal tax laws.

Section 4.3 The corporation shall not engage in any act of self-dealing as defined in Section 4941(d) of the Internal Revenue Code, or corresponding provisions of any subsequent federal tax laws.

Section 4.4 The corporation shall not retain any excess business holdings as defined in Section 4943(c) of the Internal Revenue Code, or corresponding provisions of any subsequent federal tax laws.

Section 4.5 The corporation shall not make any investments in such manner as to subject it to tax under Section 4944 of the Internal Revenue Code, or corresponding provisions of any subsequent federal tax laws.

Section 4.6 The corporation shall not make any taxable expenditures as defined in Section 4945(d) of the Internal Revenue Code, or corresponding provisions of any subsequent federal tax laws.

Section 4.7 Notwithstanding any other provisions of these Articles of Incorporation,

the corporation shall not conduct or carry on any activities not permitted to be conducted or carried: (i) by an organization exempt from taxation under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code and Regulations issued pursuant thereto as they no exist or as they may hereafter be amended; or (ii) by an organization, contributions to which are deductible under Sections 170(b)(1)(A), 170(c)(2), 2055(a) and 2522(a) of the Internal Revenue Code and said regulations as they now exist or as they may hereafter be amended.

Section 4.8 Upon the dissolution of the corporation, the Board of Directors shall, after paying or making provisions for the payment of all of the liabilities of the corporation, dispose of all of the assets of the corporation exclusively for the purposes of the corporation in such manner, or to such organization or organizations organized and operated exclusively for charitable, educational, religious, or scientific purposes as shall at the time qualify as an exempt organization or organizations under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code (or the corresponding provisions of any future United States Internal Revenue Law), as the Board of Directors shall determine. Any such assets not so disposed of shall be disposed of by the Circuit Court of the county in which the principal office of the corporation is then located, exclusively for the purposes or to such organization or organizations, as said Court shall determine, which are organized exclusively for such purposes.

ARTICLE V - MEMBERS

Section 5.1 Qualification: The only members of the corporation shall be those persons who from time to time are elected to serve as members of the Board of Directors of the corporation in accordance with the terms and provisions of Article VIII of these Articles of Incorporation. However, the Board of Directors, by a majority vote at any meeting, may confer lifetime honorary, non-voting memberships to those persons who, in the judgment of the Board

of Directors, have demonstrated an extraordinary interest in the corporation and its objectives and purposes.

. Section 5.2 Termination: The membership of any member shall be terminated at such time as the person shall cease to be a member of the Board of Directors of the corporation.

ARTICLE VI - TERM OF EXISTENCE

This corporation shall exist perpetually.
