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ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

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AMENDMENT(S)

Article I (Adding Section 8 and 9)

No part of the net earning of the corporation shall Section 8: insure to the benefit of, or be distributable to its members, trustees, directors, officers or other private persons, except at the corporation shall be authorized and empowered to pay reasonable compensation for services rendered and to make payment and distributions in furtherance of Section 501 C (3) purpose. No substantial part of the activities of the corporation shall be the carrying on of propaganda, or otherwise attempting to influence legislation, and the corporation shall not participate, or intervene in (including the publishing or distribution of statements) any political campaign on behalf of or in opposition to any candidate for public office.

Section 9: Upon dissolution of this corporation assets shall be distributed for one or more exempt purposes within the meaning of Section 501 C (3) of the Internal Revenue Code, i.e., charitable, educational, religious or scientific, or corresponding section of any future Federal Tax Code, or shall be distributed to Federal Government, or to a state or local government for a public purpose.
