ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION OF FELLOWSHIP OF CHRISTIAN LIFE CHURG

LEOWSIIII OF CHINDSTIAN LI

Article 1

The name of this corporation is Fellowship of Christian Life Church, Inc. The corporation may also be known by a shortened form of the above style, and may be represented by the shorter form to the public, to wit: Fellowship of Christian Life.

Article 11

This corporation is a religious corporation and is not organized for the private gain of any person. It is organized under the Nonprofit Religious Corporation Law of Florida exclusively for religious purposes as a local church. The church may ordain ministers of the Gospel. The duration of the corporation is perpetual.

- A. The specific purpose of this corporation is to further the Gospel of the Lord Jesus Christ, and to engage in any lawful act or activity for which corporations may be organized under the Nonprofit Religious Corporation Laws of Florida.
- B. The Corporation shall not have capital stock.
- C. The Corporation may have membership/Director as specified in the Bylaws of the corporation.

Article 111

The name and address in the State of Florida of this corporation's initial agent for service of process is: Rev William Leonard Jones, 9982 lake Georgia Drive, Orlando, Florida, 32817.

The Principal address is the same.

Article 1V

- A. This corporation is organized and operated exclusively for religious purposes within the meaning of Section 501 (c) (3) of the internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended.
- B. No substantial part of the activities of this corporation shall consist of carrying on propaganda, or otherwise attempting to influence legislation, and the corporation shall not participate or intervene in any political campaign (including the publishing or distribution of statements) on behalf of any candidate for public office.
- C. The property of the corporation is irrevocably dedicated to nonprofit religious purposes. No part of the net earnings of the Corporation shall inure to the benefit of its directors, officers, or to any other individual, except that the Corporation shall be authorized and empowered to pay reasonable compensation for services rendered, and to make payments in the furtherance of the nonprofit religious purposes of the Corporation.
- D. Upon the winding up and dissolution of the Corporation, the Board of Directors shall, after paying or adequately providing for all the debts, obligations, and liabilities of the Corporation, distribute the remaining assets of the Corporation exclusively for the nonprofit religious purposes of the Corporation in such manner as the Directors shall in its sole discretion determine, or shall distribute the remaining assets of the Corporation, to such organization or organizations which are organized and operated exclusively for the nonprofit religious purposes

- E. of the Corporation and which are tax exempt under Section 501 (c) (3) of the Code, as the Board of Directors in its sole discretion shall determine.
- F. In furtherance of its religious nonprofit tax-exempt purposes, the Corporation shall have the following authority:
 - (a) To do all acts, including ordination of ministers of the Gospel, perform all functions, and carry on all powers and activities permitted by the nonprofit corporation laws of the State of Florida or any other State in which the Corporation is qualified to act as long as the exercise of such powers is not specifically prohibited for nonprofit religious corporations or churches.
 - (b) To use all media, whether now known or hereafter discovered, including, but not limited to. print, radio, television, or churches.
 - (c) To exercise such incidental powers as may reasonably be necessary to carry out the purposes for a Corporation is established, provided that such incidental powers shall be excised in a manner consistent with its tax exempt status as a religious organization as set forth in Section 501 © (3) of the Code.
 - (d) Notwithstanding any other provisions of the Article of Incorporation or the Bylaws, the Corporation shall not except to an insubstantial degree, engage in any activity, or exercise any powers that are not in furtherance of the nonprofit religious purposes of the Corporation, and the Corporation shall not carry on any activity not permitted to be carried on (a) by a corporation exempt from Federal income tax under Section 501 (c)(3) of the corresponding section of any future United States revenue law; or (b) by a corporation, contributions to which are deductible under 170(b)(1)(A)(i) of the Code, or the corresponding section of any future United States revenue law.
