ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

Articles of Incorporation of the undersigned, a majority of whom are citizens of the United States, desiring to form a Non-Profit Corporation under the Non-Profit Corporation Law of Florida, do hereby certify:

Article I Name

The name of the Corporation is: Orange Belt YABA, Inc.

Article II Principal Office

The street address of the initial principal office of the corporation in the State of Florida is 3215 NE Lake Sebring Drive, Sebring, FL 33870. The Board of Directors may from time to time move the principal office to any other address in Florida.

Article III Purpose and Objectives

- (a) To provide an educational program, adult leadership and guidance for members.
- (b) To encourage participation and recognize achievement in the game of tenpins which maintaining the ideals of amateurism in order to preserve the eligibility of members to participate in school athletics and related programs.
- (c)To help develop in youth the ideals of sportsmanship and good citizenship, and to promote physical fitness, mental alertness, and morally sound patterns of behavior.
- (d)To provide a channel for YABA services, including the sanctioning of leagues and members, and aid in the promotion of the national, state/provincial and local programs of the Young American Bowling Alliance.
- (e)To encourage adults to serve as instructors, coaches, and other leaders for local programs.
- (f)To familiarize local instructors, coaches, sponsors, and other bowling leaders with the benefits of the Young American Bowling Alliance.
- (g)To conduct an annual association tournament to determine its championships. Eligibility to participate in the championship tournament shall be in accordance with YABA rules and eligibility rules of the local association.
- (h)To comply with the rules and regulations of the Young American Bowling Alliance and adopt and enforce such other rules and regulations not in conflict which may be deemed helpful and essential to the successful administration of the program.
- (i)In furtherance of the foregoing objects, the association shall be conducted as a nonprofit organization, organized and operated all times exclusively for charitable and educational purposes including, in particular, to foster regional, national, and international bowling competition either directly or by contributions to organizations that are recognized as exempt from federal income taxation as organizations described

in section 501(c)3 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended. In furtherance of the foregoing purposes, the association shall be organized and operated primarily to conduct or support bowling competition and to support or develop amateur bowling athletes for national or international competition within the meaning of section 501(i)(2) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended.

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Article IV Initial Registered Office and Agent

The street address of the initial registered office of the corporation in the State of Florida is 3500 South Florida Avenue, Suite 3, Lakeland, FL 33803, and the name of the corporation's initial registered agent at that address is Joseph A. Morrison, Esq. The Board of Directors may from time to time move the registered office to any other address in Florida.

Article V Dissolution

In the event that the Corporation shall be liquidated and dissolved, all of its assets remaining after payment and discharge of its duties, obligations, and liabilities shall be distributed, in such proportion as the Board of Directors shall determine, to any organization or organizations, including trusts, organized and operated exclusively for charitable and educational purposes, provided that no portion of the assets shall be distributed to any organization that is not described in section 501(c)3 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended. Any such assets not so disposed of shall be disposed of by the Circuit Court of the County in which the principal office of the Corporation is then located, exclusively for the purposes described in section 501(c)3 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, or to such organization or organizations as said Court shall determine are organized and operated exclusively for such purposes.

Article VI Directors

This corporation shall have five (5) directors initially. The number of directors may be increased or diminished from time to time, as provided in the bylaws.

Article VII Manner of Election of Directors

The manner of election of directors shall be as set forth in the OBYABA Bylaws.

Article VIII Directors' Powers

The Board of Directors shall have the power to fix or change salaries of the directors as directors and as officers, to permit contracts or other transactions between the corporation and one or more of its directors individually or businesses in which one or more of its directors are interested, and to exercise such other powers of the corporation as are not inconsistent with these Articles or with any bylaws that may be adopted by the shareholders.

Without limiting the generality of the foregoing, no contract or other transaction between this corporation and one or more of its directors, or between this corporation and any other firm of which one or more of its directors are members or employees, or in which they are interested, or between this corporation and any corporation, association or other enterprise of which one or more of its employees, or in which they are interested, shall be deemed to be invalid because of the presence of such director or corporation which acts upon, or in reference to, such contract or transaction, or because of his or their participation is such action, if the fact of such interest the Board of Directors shall, nevertheless, authorize, a majority of the directors (such interested director or directors to be counted in determining whether a quorum is present, and in calculating the majority necessary to carry such vote). This paragraph shall not be construed to invalidate any contract for other transaction that would otherwise be valid under the common or statutory law applicable thereto.
