A Florida Nonprofit Corporation
Article III Continued:

The purpose of the corporation is as follows:

The family is the basic cell of society and building block of civilization. As family life crumbles, so does civilization. Families for the Future will promote "faith-based" religious, educational and charitable activities that enhance love and stability in family life -- to hasten the coming of a 'Culture of Life' and 'Civilization of Love.' These "grass root" activities include but are not limited to the following: a resource center including brochures and pamphlets to promote family life; a web site to support family life including educational topics for public, private, and home-schooling families; a rating system for TV programs, movies, children's books, magazines, music, and videos; educational grants; family support counseling programs; financial grants for family-based activities; and support for career advancement and training.

This corporation is organized exclusively for religious, educational and charitable purposes as specified in Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, including, for such purposes, the making of distributions to organizations that qualify as exempt organizations under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, or corresponding section of any future federal tax code.

Notwithstanding any other provision of these Articles, this corporation shall not carry on any other activities not permitted to be carried on (1) by a corporation exempt from federal income tax under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, or the corresponding section of any future federal tax code, or (2) by a corporation contributions to which are deductible under Section 170(c)(2) of the Internal Revenue Code, or the corresponding section of any future federal tax code.

No substantial part of the activities of this corporation shall consist of carrying on propaganda, or otherwise attempting to influence legislation [except as otherwise provided by Section 501(h) of the Internal Revenue Code], and this corporation shall not participate in, or intervene in (including the publishing or distribution of statements), any political campaign on behalf of, or in opposition to, any candidate for public office.

The property of this corporation is irrevocably dedicated to religious, educational and charitable purposes and no part of the net earnings of this corporation shall inure to the benefit of, or be distributable to, its members, directors, officers or other private persons, except that this corporation shall be authorized and empowered to pay reasonable compensation for services rendered and to make payments and distribution in furtherance of the purposes set forth in these Articles.

Upon dissolution of this corporation, the Board of Trustees shall distribute any assets remaining after payments, or provisions for payment, of all debts and liabilities of this corporation, to one or more exempt faith-based organizations, for religious, educational and charitable purposes within the meaning of Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, or the corresponding section of any future federal tax code. Any such assets not so disposed of shall be disposed of by a Court of Competent Jurisdiction of the county in which the principal office of the corporation is then located, to one or more exempt faith-based organizations, for religious, educational and charitable purposes within the meaning of Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, as such Court shall determine.
