OF

We, the undersigned, with other persons being desirous of forming a Florida not-for-profit corporation, under the provisions of Chapter 617 of the Florida Statutes, do agree to the following:

ARTICLE I

The name of this corporation is:

COMMUNITY OUTREACH RESOURCES, INC.

ARTICLE II

The principal place of business of this corporation shall be 956 W. Hal McRae Blvd., Avon Park, Florida 33825. The mailing address of this corporation shall be P.O. Box 6915, Avon Park, Florida 33825-9999.

ARTICLE III

The general purpose of the business or businesses to be transacted by this corporation, together with and in addition to the authority and powers conferred by the laws of the State of Florida is to provide the following.

1. Provide youth training, mentoring, crime prevention including providing education to students suspended from the public school systems.
2. Provide health education
 - A. Cardiovascular, High Blood Pressure, Cholesterol education and prevention programs.
 - B. HIV and AIDS awareness and prevention programs, Youth Abstinence training.
3. Provide food support for homeless.

ARTICLE IV

The membership of this corporation shall constitute all persons hereinafter named as officers and directors and such other persons whom from time to time may become members by a majority vote and according to the bylaws.

ARTICLE V



PROVISIONS OF THE ARTICLES

PURPOSE: Said organization is organized exclusively for charitable, educational, and scientific purposes, including, for such purposes, the making of distributions to organizations that qualify as exempt organizations under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, or corresponding section of any future federal tax code.

NONPROFIT CAPITALIZATION: No part of the income of the corporation shall inure to the benefit of any member, trustee, officer or director of the Corporation, or any private individual (except that reasonable compensation may be paid for services rendered to or for the Corporation in Corporation or any private person shall be entitled to share in the distribution of any of the Corporate assets on dissolution of the Corporation.

MEMBER LIABILITY: The private property of this Corporation's members, directors or officers shall not be subject to the payment of Corporate debts to any extent whatsoever. No director or officer shall be liable for relying in good faith upon the books or account or reports made to the Corporation by any of its officials, members or by an independent accountant selected by the Board of directors or by any committee so designated by the Corporation, or in relying in good faith upon any other records of the Corporation.

ACTIVITIES PROHIBITED: No substantial part of the activities of the Corporation shall be carrying on of propaganda, or otherwise attempting to influence legislation, and the Corporation shall not participate in, or intervene in (including the publishing or distribution of statements) any political campaign on behalf of any candidate for public office. Notwithstanding any other provision of these Articles, the Corporation shall not carry on any other activities not permitted to be carried on (a) by a corporation exempt from Federal income tax under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954 (or the corresponding provision of any future United States Internal Revenue Law or (b) by a corporation, contributions to which are deductible under section 170 (c)(2) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954 (or the corresponding provision of any future United States Internal Revenue Law).

DISSOLUTION: Upon dissolution of the Corporation, the Corporation shall, after paying or making provision for the payment of the debts and obligations of the Corporation distribute the remaining assets and property (after necessary expenses thereof) to such organizations as shall qualify as an exempt organization or organizations under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954, as named. Any such assets not disposed of shall be disposed of by the Circuit Court of the county in which the principal office of the Corporation is located, exclusively for such purposes or to such organizations as said Court shall determine, which are organized for such purposes as qualify them as exempt organizations.
