ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION OF

TAMPA DEVELOPMENT CONSORTIUM, INC.

SECRETARY PM 4:15 In compliance with the requirements of the Laws of the State of Florida, the undersigned, all of whom are residents of Hillsborough County, Florida, and all of whom are of full age, have this day voluntarily associated themselves to gather for the purpose of forming a corporation not for profit and do hereby certify:

ARTICLE I NAME AND ADDRESS OF CORPORATION

The name of the corporation is TAMPA DEVELOPMENT CONSORTIUM, INC., hereinafter called the "Corporation." The principal office of the Corporation is initially 400 East Palm Avenue. Tampa, Florida 33602.

ARTICLE II **DURATION OF THE CORPORATION**

The term of existence of the Corporation is perpetual.

ARTICLE III PURPOSE OF CORPORATION

The purpose for which the corporation was incorporated under the Non-Profit Corporation Law of the State of Florida and the business and objects to be carried on and promoted by it are as follows:

- A. This Corporation is organized exclusively for charitable and/or educational purposes, including, for such purposes the making of distributions to organizations which qualify as exempt organizations under Section 501 (c) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, or the corresponding section of any future United States Internal Revenue law, or to the Secretary of Housing and Urban Development for the time being exclusively for a public purpose. In pursuance of the foregoing purposes, the Corporation shall have the power to meet all the Federal, State, County or City guidelines to qualify as a Community Housing Development Organization, provide affordable housing for low to moderate income families, elderly and handicapped persons with housing facilities and services specially designed to meet their economic, physical, social, and/or psychological needs, and to promote their health, security, happiness, and services to be predicated upon the provision, maintenance, and operation thereof on a nonprofit basis
- B. To solicit, receive, maintain and administer a fund, or funds, contributions received by gifts, deed, bequest, or devise and otherwise to acquire money, securities, real or personal property, rights, and services of every kind and description, and to hold, invest expend, contribute, use sell or otherwise dispose of any money, securities, property rights, or services so acquired for the above mentioned purposes.

- C. To borrow or raise or raise money and to make, accept, endorse, execute, and issue promissory notes from time to time, as may be necessary to carry out the purposes of the Corporation.
- D. To enter into, make and perform contracts of every kind and description, and to sue and to be sued as a Corporation
- E. To obtain information, conduct research, surveys, and studies; and to prepare reports as to markets, programs, services, skills, sources of financing, and other matters necessary to effect the purposes of the Corporation.

ARTICLE IV POWERS

The Corporation is empowered to:

- A. To enter into, make, perform and carry out contracts of every kind and description in furtherance of its corporate purposes.
- B. To buy, own, sell, assign, mortgage, or lease any interest in real estate and personal property and to construct, maintain, and operate improvements thereon necessary or incident to the accomplishment of the purposes set forth in Article III hereof.
- C. To borrow, or raise monies for any of the purposes of the Corporation and, from, time to time without limit as to amount, to draw, make, accept, endorse, execute, and issue promissory notes, drafts, bills of exchange, warrants, bonds, debentures and other negotiable or non-negotiable instruments, and evidence of indebtedness, and to secure the payment of any thereof and of the interest thereon by mortgage upon or pledge, conveyance or assigned in trust of the whole or part of the property of the Corporation, whether at the time owned or thereafter acquired, and to sell, pledge or otherwise dispose of such bonds or other obligations of the Corporation for its corporate purposes.
- D. To lend money, invest and reinvest its funds, and take and hold real and personal property as security for the payment of funds so loaned and invested to any person, firm or corporation.
- E. To acquire construct, convert or expand either plant facilities and business or residential homes or parcels for lease or sale.
- F. To do and perform all acts reasonable and necessary to accomplish the purposes of the Corporation, including the execution of a Use Agreement, and Amended Regulatory Agreement and any other agreements required by the Secretary of the Department of Housing and Urban Development ("HUD"), State, County, or City Housing Governmental Agencies.
- G. To design, plan, develop, and construct, any and all aspects relating to the construction of low to moderate income single family and multi-family housing and/or construction of commercial properties, and/or management of any structures.

- H. To have one or more offices and subject to the restrictions or limitations imposed by law, to purchase or otherwise acquire, hold, own, mortgage, sell, convey or otherwise dispose of real and personal property in furtherance of the corporate purposes, in the course of the transaction of the affairs of the Corporation.
- I. To have and exercise all powers incidental to the foregoing purposes, and to engage in any lawful activity permitted under the not for profit laws of the State of Florida.

ARTICLE V LIMITATIONS

No part of the net earnings of the Corporation shall inure to the benefit of, or be distributable to its members, directors, officers, or other private persons, except that the Corporation shall be authorized and empowered to pay reasonable compensation for services rendered and to make payments and distributions in furtherance of the purposes set forth in Article III hereof. No substantial part of the activities of the Corporation shall be the carrying on of propaganda, or otherwise attempting to influence legislation, and the Corporation shall not participate in, or intervene in (including the publishing or distribution of statements) any political campaign on behalf of any candidate for public office. Notwithstanding any other provisions of these articles, the Corporation shall not carry on any other activities not permitted to be carried on by a corporation exempt from Federal Income Tax under section 501 (c) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954, as amended (the Code), or the corresponding provision of any subsequent United States Internal Revenue law or (b) by a corporation, contributions to which are deductible under section 170 (c) (2) of the Code, or the corresponding provisions of any subsequent United States Internal Revenue law.

ARTICLE VI DIRECTORS AND OFFICERS OF THE CORPORATION

Directors will be elected by electing a nominating committee who will bring nominees to the Board. The full Board of Directors will then elect the directors.

ARTICLE VII MEMBERSHIP

Membership in the Corporation shall, at all times be limited to six (6) but no more than 10 individuals who are at least 18 years of age and who support the aims, goals and purposes of this Corporation as expressed in Article III of these Articles of Incorporation and who are accepted into membership by the Board of Directors.

ARTICLE VIII BYLAWS

The Bylaws of the Corporation shall govern its internal organization and management. The Bylaws shall be made, altered or rescinded by the Board of Directors of the Corporation.

ARTICLE IX AMENDMENT OF ARTICLES

These Articles of Incorporation may be amended by the act of the Board of Directors of the Corporation. Such Amendments may be proposed and adopted in the manner provided by the Bylaws of the Corporation.

ARTICLE X DISSOLUTION

In the event of dissolution of the Corporation, the Board of Directors shall, after paying or making provision for the payment of all of the liabilities of the Corporation, dispose of all of the assets of the Corporation exclusively for the purpose of the Corporation in such manner, or to such organization organized and operated exclusively for charitable, educational, religious, or scientific purposes as shall at the time qualify as an exempt organization or organizations under Section 501 (c) (3) of the Code or the corresponding provision of any subsequent United States Internal Revenue law, as the Board of Directors shall determine. Any such assets not so disposed of shall be disposed of by the Circuit Court of the county in which the principal office of the Corporation is then located, exclusively for such purposes or to such organization or organizations, as said Court shall determine, which are organized and operated exclusively for such purposes.
