Articles of Amendment to Articles of Incorporation of Officer Kris Kringle, Inc.

Attachment A

Article III Purpose (amended)

Officer Kris Kringle, Inc. is organized exclusively for charitable purposes, within the meaning of Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code (or corresponding sections of any future Federal tax code.) Officer Kris Kringle, Inc. will use its donations to purchase presents for children under 16 years of age that are either children of low income families, children that are victims of violent crimes or terminally ill children. No part of the net earnings of the corporation/organization shall inure to the benefit of, or be distributable to its members, trustees, directors, officers or other private persons, except that the corporation/organization shall be authorized and empowered to pay reasonable compensation for services rendered and to make payments and distributions in furtherance of Section 501 (c)(3) purposes. No substantial part of the activities of the corporation/organization shall be carrying on of propaganda, or otherwise attempting to influence legislation, and the corporation/organization shall not participate in, or intervene in (including the publishing or distribution of statements) any political campaign on behalf of or in opposition to any candidate for public office. Not withstanding any other provision of these articles, the corporation/organization shall not carry on any other activities not permitted to be carried on (a) by a corporation/organization exempt from Federal income tax under Section 501 (c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code (or corresponding section of any future Federal tax code) or (b) by a corporation/organization, contributions to which are deductible under Section 170(c)(2) of the Internal Revenue Code (or corresponding section of any future Federal tax code.) Upon dissolution of this corporation/organization assets shall be distributed for one or more exempt purposes within the meaning of Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code. i.e. charitable, educational, religious, scientific, or corresponding section of any future Federal tax code, or shall be distributed to the Federal government, or to a state or local government for a public purpose.
