A NON-PROFIT ORGANIZATION

We, the undersigned, acting as incorporators of a corporation pursuant to Chapters 617, Part I, of Florida Statutes, adopt the following Articles of Incorporation of such corporation:

ARTICLE I - NAME

The name of this corporation will be:

El Pequeño Café, Inc.

Hereafter referred to as the "Corporation",

ARTICLE II - REGISTERED OFFICE AND REGISTERED AGENT

ARTICLE III -CORPORATE PURPOSE

The purposes for which the Corporation is organized are:

- 1. El Pequeño Café, Inc. is a non-profit organization that has been functioning with a De Facto existence since November, 2001.
- 2. The members of El Pequeño Café, Inc. are working together to develop the main objective of the organization: to promote the Hispanic culture in the United States. Currents methods implemented are:

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- a. Publish a cultural magazine in Spanish.
- b. Publish books in Spanish.
- c. Sponsor all kinds of cultural activities.

ARTICLE IV - OFFICERS

The qualifications and manner of election or appointment of the directors shall be regulated by the bylaws.

ARTICLE V – BOARD OF DIRECTORS

The number of Directors which shall constitute the whole Board shall be six (6), two (2) of which shall be Honorary board members, or such as from time to time shall be fixed by the bylaws, but in no event shall be less than three (3).

ARTICLE VII – GENERAL

All income and assets of the Corporation, above necessary expenses, shall be administrated solely and exclusively for the corporate purposes consistent with these Articles which are selected by the Board of Directors.

This Corporation shall have no capital stock and shall pay no dividends to its incorporators, directors or officers. In addition, no part of the income of the Corporation shall be distributed to its directors, officers or incorporators; provided that the Corporation may pay compensation in any reasonable services rendered and may confer benefit upon its members in conformity with its purposes.

ARTICLE VIII - NO PECUNIARY GAIN

The Corporation shall not, incidentally or otherwise, afford or pay any pecuniary gain or remuneration to its directors or officers as such, and no part of the net income or net earnings of the Corporation shall, directly or indirectly, be distributable to or to otherwise inure to the benefit of any director or officer of, or any other person having a personnel and private interest in the activities of the Corporation; provided, however, that the Corporation may pay reasonable compensation for services rendered and property and supplies furnished to the Corporation in furtherance of its purposes described in Article III hereof.

ARTICLE IX - NO PERSONAL LIABILITY

Directors, and officers of the Corporation shall not be personally liable for the payment of any debts or obligations of the Corporation of any nature whatsoever, nor shall any of the property of the directors and officers be subject to the payment of the debts or obligations of the Corporation to any extent whatsoever.

ARTICLE X – DISSOLUTION OF THE CORPORATION

The Board of Directors may dissolve this corporation with the prior approval of two-thirds (2/3) majority vote of the general voting; provided that notice of purpose for the meeting has been furnished in writing to each member of the Corporation at least ten (10) days prior to the meeting where a vote for dissolution shall take place.

ARTICLE XI - SPECIAL CONSIDERATIONS

1. The special character of the Corporation calls for the following:

- a. All the information pertaining to El Pequeño Café, Inc. Corporation is strictly and highly confidential.
- b. The publications and activities of El Pequeño Café, Inc. must be in full agreement with the human values established in the United Nations' Universal Declaration of Human Rights. The rights stipulated in the United Nations' Universal Declaration of Human Rights cannot be used against those rights.

BYLAW OF El Pequeño Café, Inc.

Article 1

OFFICES

The principal office of the Corporation shall be in the State of Florida.
