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ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

OF

OCEAN TOWER ONE CONDOMINIUM ASSOCIATION, INC.

A Corporation Not For Profit

In order to form a corporation under the Laws of Florida for the formation of corporations not for profit, we, the undersigned, hereby associate ourselves into a corporation (the "Condominium Association") for the purposes and with the powers herein specified; and to that end we do, by these Articles of Incorporation, set forth:

ARTICLE I.

The name and principal address of the corporation shall be:

ARTICLE II.

The purposes and objects of the Condominium Association shall be to administer the operation and management of Ocean Tower One, a Condominium (the "Condominium"), to be established as a condominium in accordance with the Florida Condominium Act (the "Act") upon certain land situated in Miami-Dade County, Florida (the "Land"); and to perform the acts and duties incident to operation and management of the Condominium in accordance with the provisions of these Articles of Incorporation, the Bylaws of the Condominium Association which will be adopted (the "Bylaws"), and the Declaration of Condominium of the Condominium (the "Declaration"), which will be recorded in the Public Records of Miami-Dade County, Florida, if, as and when the Land, and the improvements constructed thereon, are submitted to the condominium form of ownership; and to own, operate, encumber, lease, manage, sell, convey, exchange, and otherwise deal with the Land, the improvements and such other property, real and/or personal, as may be or become part of the Condominium (the "Condominium Property") to the extent necessary or convenient in the administration of the Condominium. The Condominium Association shall be conducted as a non-profit organization for the benefit of its members.

ARTICLE III.

The Condominium Association shall have the following powers:

A. All of the powers and privileges granted to corporations not for profit under the laws pursuant to which this corporation is chartered.

- B. All of the powers reasonably necessary to implement and effectuate the purposes of the Condominium Association, including, without limitation, the power, authority and right to:
- Make and establish reasonable rules and regulations governing use of the Units and Common Elements in and of the Condominium, as such terms are defined in the Declaration.
- 2. Levy and collect assessments against members of the Condominium Association to defray the Common Expenses of the Condominium, as provided in the Declaration and the Bylaws; including the right to levy and collect assessments for the purpose of acquiring, owning, holding, operating, leasing, encumbering, selling, conveying, exchanging, managing and otherwise dealing with the Condominium Property, including the Units, which may be necessary or convenient in the operation and management of the Condominium and in accomplishing the purposes set forth in the Declaration.
- 3. Maintain, repair, replace, operate and manage the Condominium Property, including the right to reconstruct improvements after casualty and further to improve and add to the Condominium Property.
- 4. Contract for the management of the Condominium and, in connection therewith, to delegate powers and duties of the Condominium Association to the extent and in the manner permitted by the Declaration, the Bylaws and the Act.
- 5. Enforce the provisions of these Articles of Incorporation, the Declaration, the Bylaws, and all rules and regulations governing use of the Condominium which may from time to time be established.
- 6. Exercise, undertake and accomplish all of the rights, duties and obligations which may be granted to or imposed upon the Condominium Association in the Declaration and the Act.

ARTICLE IV.

The qualification of members, the manner of their admission to and termination of membership, and voting by members shall be as follows:

- A. The record Owners (as defined in the Declaration) of all Units in the Condominium from time to time shall be members of the Condominium Association, and no other persons or entities shall be entitled to membership, except as provided for in Paragraph \underline{F} , Article \underline{IV} hereof.
- B. Membership shall be established by the acquisition of fee title to a Unit in the Condominium, or by acquisition of a fee ownership interest therein, by voluntary conveyance or operation of law, and the membership of any person or entity shall be automatically terminated when such person or entity is divested of all title or ownership in such Unit; provided, that nothing herein contained shall be construed as terminating the membership of any person or

entity owning fee attle to or a fee ownership interest in two or more Units at any time while such person or entity shall retain fee title to or a fee ownership interest in any Unit.

- C. The interest of a member in the funds and assets of the Condominium Association cannot be assigned, hypothecated, transferred or encumbered in any manner, except as an appurtenance to the Unit(s) owned by such member. The funds and assets of the Condominium Association shall be expended, held or used only for the benefit of the membership and for the purposes authorized herein, in the Declaration, and in the Bylaws.
- D. On all matters on which the membership shall be entitled to vote, there shall be one, and only one, vote for each Unit in the Condominium, which vote may be exercised or cast by the Owner(s) of each Unit as will be provided for in the Bylaws. Should any member own more than one Unit, such member shall be entitled to exercise or cast one (1) vote for each such Unit owned, in the manner provided by the Bylaws.
- E. The Condominium Association will have two (2) classes of membership, as follows:
 - (a) Class A Members, which will consist of all of the Owners excluding the Class F Members: and
 - (b) Class F Members which will consist of only the Owners of the following Units (the "F Units"):

Class F Members will have the exclusive right to vote on matters concerning the level, amount, type, style, design and decoration of the furniture, fixtures, finishings, equipment and other facilities owned, held or provided for the exclusive use, benefit and enjoyment of the Owners of the F Units (collectively, the "F1 Amenities"), as well as the operation, use, maintenance, repair and replacement thereof. All Members of both classes of membership will, together, be entitled to vote on all other matters affecting the Units.

The Condominium Association will, pursuant to Article 14 of the Declaration, charge each Class F Member his or her pro rata share (based on the relative square footage of the F Type Units as set forth on Exhibit 6 to the Condominium Declaration) of the costs and expenses associated with the operation, use, maintenance, repair and replacement of the F1 Amenities which are over and above the costs and expenses which would be associated with the operation, use, maintenance, repair and replacement of Building standard amenities. The Board of Directors will, from time to time, reasonably determine the amount to be charged to the Class F Members pursuant to the foregoing.

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F. Until such time as the Condominium is established by recordation of the Declaration, the membership of the Condominium Association shall be comprised of the subscribers to these Articles, each of whom shall be entitled to cast a vote on all matters upon which the membership would be entitled to vote.

ARTICLE V.

The Condominium is part of a residential community known as "The Ocean Club" (the "Community"). The operations and management of the Community are administered by the Ocean Club Community Association, Inc., a Florida not for profit corporation (the "Community Association") pursuant to the Declaration of Covenants, Restrictions and Easements for the Community recorded at Official Records Book 17460, Page 3896 of the Public Records of Miami-Dade County, Florida, as amended and supplemented from time to time (the "Community Association Declaration"). The Community Association Declaration contains certain rules, regulations and restrictions relating to use of common property within the Community, as well as units in individual condominiums within the Community. Each Unit Owner of the Condominium (together with all other unit owners of condominiums within the Community) will be members of the Community Association. Such members will be represented in all matters concerning the Community Association exclusively by a "Condominium Voting Representative" representing the Condominium in which such unit owner's unit is located. The Condominium Voting Representative shall be elected in the manner set forth in the Bylaws. Each Condominium Voting Representative will be entitled to cast one (1) vote on behalf of the condominium which he or she represents. Following election or substitution of a Condominium Voting Representative, the president, vice president or other executive officer of the Condominium Association shall certify to the Community Association the name of the Condominium Voting Representative.

During any period in which a directorship of the Community Association is designated for this Condominium Association, each Member of the Condominium Association and the Board of Eirectors may nominate Persons to fill such directorship in the manner set forth in the Bylaws, and based upon such nominations (as well as nominations from other condominium associations) the Condominium Voting Representatives will elect all of the directors of the Community Association in the manner set forth in the Community Association Bylaws.

ARTICLE VI.

The Condominium Association shall have perpetual existence.

ARTICLE VII.

The principal office of the Condominium Association shall be located in Florida, but the Condominium Association may maintain offices and transact business in such places, within or without the State of Florida, as may from time to time be designated by the Board of Directors.

ARTICLE VIII.

The affairs of the Condominium Association shall be managed by the President of the Condominium Association, assisted by the Vice President(s), Secretary and Treasurer and, if any, the Assistant Secretaries and Assistant Treasurers (collectively, the "Officers"), subject to the directions of the Board of Directors. The Board of Directors, or the President with the approval of the Board of Directors, may employ a managing agent, agency, and/or other managerial and supervisory personnel or entity to administer or assist in the administration of the operation and management of the Condominium and the affairs of the Condominium Association, and any and all such person(s) and/or entity(ies) may be so employed without regard to whether any such person or entity is a member of the Condominium Association or a Director or officer of the Condominium Association, as the case may be. Notwithstanding the foregoing, with respect to the level, amount, type, style, design and decoration of F1 Amenities, as well as the operation, use, maintenance, repair and replacement thereof, the Association will act in accordance with the majority vote of the Class F Members represented at any meeting of Class F Members properly noticed and at which a quorum and an Officer of the Condominium Association is present or in a written consent signed by all of the Class F Members.

ARTICLE IX.

The number of members on the first Board of Directors, who shall serve until their successors are designated by developer or elected at the first annual meeting of the Condominium Association following recordation of the Declaration of Condominium, shall be three. The number of members of succeeding Boards of Directors shall also be three, or as otherwise provided from time to time by the Bylaws, and they shall be elected by Key Biscayne Ocean Club Limited Partnership, a Delaware limited partnership ("Developer") or the members of the Condominium Association at the annual meetings of the membership as provided by the Bylaws. Each of the members of all succeeding Boards of Directors shall be members of the Condominium Association or shall be authorized representatives, officers or employees of a corporate member of the Condominium Association, except for those Directors who are appointed by the Developer.

When (but not before) Unit Owners other than Developer own at least fifteen percent (15%) of the Units of the Condominium, the Unit Owners of the Condominium, other than Developer, shall be entitled to elect, as a group and in a manner to be provided in the Bylaws, one-third (1/3) of the members of the Board of Directors. Unit Owners of all Condominiums, other than Developer, shall be entitled to elect, as a group and in a manner to be provided in the Bylaws, a majority of the members of the Board of Directors upon the earlier to occur of:

- (a) Three years after 50 percent of the Units have been conveyed to purchasers;
- (b) Three months after 90 percent of the Units have been conveyed to purchasers;

- (c) When all the Units have been completed, some of them have been conveyed to purchasers, and none of the others are being offcred for sale by Developer in the ordinary course of business;
- (d) When some of the Units have been conveyed to purchasers and none of the others are being constructed or offered for sale by Developer in the ordinary course of business; or
 - (e) Seven years after recordation of the Declaration of Condominium.

Developer shall have the right to elect all members of the Board of Directors of the Condominium Association which Unit Owners other than Developer are not entitled to elect; and, in any event, Developer shall have the right to elect not less than one (1) member of the Board of Directors of the Condominium Association as long as Developer holds for sale in the ordinary course of business at least five percent (5%) of the Units. Notwithstanding the foregoing, Developer shall be entitled at any time to waive in writing its rights hereunder, and thereafter to vote in elections for members of the Board of Directors of the Condominium Association in the same manner as any other Unit Owner of the Condominium Association. At the time Unit Owners other than Developer elect a majority of the members of the Board of Directors, Developer shall relinquish control of the Condominium Association and shall deliver to the Condominium Association, at Developer's expense, all property of the Unit Owners and of the Condominium Association held or controlled by Developer.

Within seventy-five (75) days after the Unit Owners other than Developer are entitled to elect a member or members of the Board of Directors, the Condominium Association shall call, and give not less than sixty (60) days notice of a meeting at which such Directors are to be elected, which elections will otherwise be held in accordance with the provisions of the Bylaws.

ARTICLE X.

The Board of Directors shall elect and may by majority vote separate or remove from office the President, Secretary, Treasurer, and as many Vice Presidents, Assistant Secretaries and Assistant Treasurers as the Board of Directors shall deem advisable from time to time. The President shall be elected from the membership of the Board of Directors, but no other officer need be a Director. The same person may hold two offices, the duties of which are not incompatible; provided, however, that the office of President and Vice President shall not be held by the same person, nor shall the office of President and Secretary or Assistant Secretary be held by the same person.

ARTICLE XI.

The names and addresses of the members of the first Board of Directors, who, subject to the provisions of the laws of Florida, these Articles of Incorporation and the Bylaws, shall hold office until the first annual meeting of the Condominium Association after recordation of the Declaration of Condominium, and thereafter until their successors are selected and have qualified, are as follows:

ARTICLE XIII.

The officers of the Condominium Association, who shall hold office until their successors are elected pursuant to these Articles of Incorporation and the Bylaws, and have qualified, shall be the following:

President John A. Hinson

Vice President Christian M. Cobb

Secretary/Treasurer Donald J. Elbert

ARTICLE XIV.

The original Bylaws of the Condominium Association shall be adopted by the approval of a majority of the subscribers to these Articles of Incorporation at a meeting at which each of the subscribers are present, and, thereafter, the Bylaws may be amended, altered or rescinded only by affirmative vote of seventy-five percent (75%) of the votes entitled to be cast by members of the Condominium Association at a duly called and held meeting thereof; provided, however, notwithstanding the foregoing, the Class F Members will have the exclusive right to cast votes with respect to any amendment, alteration or rescission of the Bylaws uniquely affecting the F1 Amenities.

ARTICLE XV.

Every Director and every officer of the Condominium Association shall be indemnified by the Condominium Association against all expenses and liabilities, including attorneys' and legal assistants' fees, reasonably incurred by or imposed upon him in connection with any proceeding to which he may be a party, or in which he may become involved, by reason of his being or having been a Director or officer of the Condominium Association, whether or not he is a Director or officer at the time such expenses are incurred, except in such cases wherein the Director or officer is adjudged guilty of willful misfeasance, malfeasance or nonfeasance in the performance of his duties; provided that, in the event of any claim for reimbursement or indemnification hereunder based upon a settlement by the Director or officer seeking such reimbursement or indemnification, the indemnification herein shall apply only if the Board of Directors approves such settlement and reimbursement as being in the best interests of the Condominium Association. The foregoing right of indemnification shall be in addition to and not exclusive of all other rights to which such Director or officer may be entitled.

ARTICLE XVI.

An amendment or amendments to these Articles of Incorporation may be proposed by the Board of Directors of the Condominium Association acting upon a vote of the majority of the Directors, or by the members of the Condominium Association owning a majority of the Units in the Condominium, whether meeting as members or by instrument in writing signed by them. Upon any amendment or amendments to these Articles of Incorporation being proposed by the Board of Directors or members, such proposed amendment or amendments shall be transmitted to the President of the Condominium Association, or the acting chief executive officer in the absence of the President, who shall thereupon call a special meeting of the members of the Condominium Association for a date not sooner than fourteen (14) days or later than sixty (60) days from the receipt by him of the proposed amendment or amendments, and it shall be the duty of the Secretary to give each member written notice of such meeting stating the time and place of the meeting and reciting the proposed amendment or amendments in reasonably detailed form, which notice shall be given in the same manner as notice of the call of a special meeting of the members as the procedure for giving such notice is described in the Bylaws; provided, that proposed amendments to these Articles of Incorporation may be considered and voted upon at annual meetings of the members. If mailed, such notice shall be deemed to be properly given when deposited in the United States mail, addressed to the member at his post office address as it appears on the records of the Condominium Association, with postage thereon prepaid. Any member may, by written waiver of notice signed by such member, waive such notice, and such waiver when filed in the records of the Condominium Association. whether before, during or after the holding of the meeting, shall be deemed equivalent to the giving of such notice to such member. At such meeting the amendment or amendments proposed must be approved by an affirmative vote of not less than the owners of seventy-five percent (75%) of those Units in the Condominium which are represented in person or by proxy as allowed by applicable law at any meeting at which a quorum is present in order for such amendment or amendments to become effective. Thereupon, such amendment or amendments of these Articles of Incorporation shall be transcribed and certified in such form as may be necessary to file the same in the office of the Secretary of State of the State of Florida. A certified copy of each such amendment of these Articles of Incorporation shall be recorded in the

Public Records of Mismi-Dade County, Florida, within thirty (30) days from the date on which the same is filed in the office of the Secretary of State. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Article XVI, no amendment to these Articles of Incorporation which shall abridge, amend or alter the right of Developer to designate and select members of the Board of Directors of the Condominium Association, as provided in Article IX hereof, may be adopted or become effective without the prior written consent of Developer. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Article XVI, no amendment to these Articles of Incorporation affecting only the F1 Amenities will be adopted without the affirmative vote of the required number of Class F Members.

ARTICLE XVII.

H. William Walker, Jr. is hereby designated as the registered agent of the Condominium Association, and 200 South Biscayne Boulevard, Suite 5000, Miami, Florida 33131 is hereby designated as the registered office of the Condominium Association.
