ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

OF

GLOBAL CATALYST FOUNDATION. INC.



The undersigned incorporator, for the purposes of forming a corporation under the Florida Not for Profit Corporation Act, hereby adopts the following Articles of Incorporation:

ARTICLE I - NAME

The name of the corporation shall be:

GLOBAL CATALYST FOUNDATION, INC.

ARTICLE II- PRINCIPAL OFFICE

The principal place of business and mailing address of this corporation shall be:

2202 North West Shore Boulevard Suite 110 Tampa, Florida 33607

ARTICLE III - PURPOSES

The specific purposes for which the corporation is organized are:

(a) For scientific, educational and charitable purposes within the meaning of Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, and in this connection to give, convey or assign any of its property outright, or upon lawful terms regarding the use thereof, to other organizations that shall be organized and operated exclusively for religious, charitable, scientific, literary or educational purposes; (b) transfers of property to such organizations shall, to the extent then permitted by the Internal Revenue Code, be exempt from gift, succession, inheritance, estate or death taxes (by whatever name called) imposed by the Internal Revenue Code; and (c) such organizations shall, to the extent then permitted under the Internal Revenue Code, be exempt from income taxes imposed by the Internal Revenue Code. The purposes for which the corporation is organized shall be confined to those which are strictly scientific, educational and charitable.

- No part of the net earnings of the organization shall inure to the benefit of, or be 2. distributable to its members, trustees, officers, or other private persons, except that the organization shall be authorized and empowered to pay reasonable compensation for services rendered and to make payments and distributions in furtherance of the purposes set forth in the purposes clause hereof. No substantial part of the activities of the organization shall be the carrying on of propaganda, or otherwise attempting to influence legislation, and the organization shall not participate in, or intervene in (including the publishing or distribution of statements) any political campaign on behalf of any candidate for public office. Notwithstanding any other provision of this document, the organization shall not carry on any other activities not permitted to be carried on (a) by an organization exempt from federal income tax under Section 501(c) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, or the corresponding section of any future federal tax code, or (b) by an organization, contributions to which are deductible under Section 170(c) (2) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, or the corresponding section of any future federal tax code.
 - 3. Upon the dissolution of the organization, assets shall be distributed for one or more exempt purposes within the meaning of Section 501(c) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, or the corresponding section of any future federal tax code, or shall be distributed to the federal government, or to a state or local government, for a public purpose.

ARTICLE IV - MANNER OF ELECTION OF DIRECTORS

The manner in which the directors are elected or appointed is:

The initial three directors of the corporation shall be elected by the Incorporator. Thereafter, newly created directorships resulting from an increase in the number of directors and vacancies occurring on the board for any reason may be filled by a vote of the majority of the directors then in office.
