

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Articles of Incorporation of  
VIRTUOUS WOMAN ENTERPRISES, INC.  
a Florida Not For Profit Corporation

The undersigned persons, acting as incorporators of a corporation not for profit under the Florida Not For Profit Corporation Act, as set forth in Chapter 617 of the Florida Statutes, adopt the following articles of incorporation for the corporation:

Article I

The name of the corporation is VIRTUOUS WOMAN ENTERPRISES, INC.

Article II

The corporation shall have perpetual duration.

Article III

The corporation is a not for profit corporation. The purpose for which the corporation is organized is:

(a). The specific and primary purposes for which this corporation is formed is to empower women and to provide for their spiritual enhancement through Christian education.

(b). The general purposes for which this corporation is formed are to operate exclusively for religious, charitable, and educational purposes which will qualify it as an exempt organization under 26 USCA §501(c)(3), or corresponding provisions of any subsequent federal tax laws, including, for those purposes, the making of distributions to organizations which qualify as tax-exempt organizations under that Section.

(c). This corporation shall not, as a substantial part of its activities, carry on propaganda or otherwise attempt to influence legislation; nor shall it participate or intervene (by publication or distribution of any statements or otherwise) in any political campaign on behalf of any candidate for public office.

Article IV

a) Address The street address of the principal office of the Corporation in the State of Florida is 1938 Lillie Street, Fort Myers, Florida 33916. The Board of Directors may from time to time move the principal office to any other address in Florida.

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b) Resident Agent The name and address of the resident agent of the Corporation upon whom service of process may be served is MICHAEL D. RANDOLPH, ESQ., 1619 Jackson Street, Fort Myers, Florida 33901, until and unless changed as prescribed by law.

#### Article V

The powers of this corporation shall be exercised, its property controlled, and its affairs conducted by a board of directors. The number of directors of the corporation shall be five; provided, however, that that number may be changed by a bylaw duly adopted pursuant to the bylaws of this corporation.

The directors named here as the first board of directors shall hold office until the first meeting of members, to be held on April 1, 2002, at the principal address provided in Article IV(a), Florida, at which time an election of directors shall be held.

Directors elected at the first annual meeting, and at all subsequent times, shall serve for a term of 1 year until the second annual meeting following the election of directors and until the qualification of the successors in office. Annual meetings shall be held at 1:00 P.M., on the first Monday in January of each year at the principal office of the corporation, or at any other place or places designated by the board of directors by resolution.

Any action required or permitted to be taken by the board of directors under any provision of law may be taken without a meeting, if all the members of the board individually or collectively consent in writing to the action. Written consent or consents shall be filed with the minutes of the proceedings of the board, and any action by written consent shall have the same force and effect as if taken by unanimous vote of the directors. Any certificate or other document filed under any provision of law that relates to action taken in this manner shall state that the action was taken by unanimous written consent of the board of directors without a meeting and that the articles of incorporation and bylaws of this corporation authorize the directors to act in this manner. This statement shall be prima facie evidence of the directors' authority.

#### Article VI

The name and address of each incorporator are: Michael D. Randolph, Esq., 1619 Jackson Street, Fort Myers, Lee County, Florida, 33901.

#### Article VII

The board of directors shall elect the following officers: president, vice-president, treasurer, and secretary, and any other officers which the bylaws of this corporation authorize the directors to elect. Initially, officers shall be elected at the first annual meeting of the board of directors. Until that election is held, the following persons shall serve as corporate officers as indicated in Article V.

#### Article VIII

Subject to the limitations contained in the bylaws and any limitations set forth in the Florida Not For Profit Corporation Act described above, the bylaws of this corporation may be made, altered, rescinded, added to, or new bylaws may be adopted, either by a resolution of the board of directors or by following the procedure set forth in the bylaws.

Article IX

The property of this corporation is irrevocably dedicated to charitable purposes and no part of the net income or assets of this corporation shall ever inure to the benefit of any director, officer, or member, or to the benefit of any private individual.

Article X

On the dissolution or winding up of this corporation, its assets remaining after payment, or provision for payment, of all debts and liabilities of the corporation, shall be distributed to a not for profit fund, foundation, or corporation which is organized and operated exclusively for religious or charitable purposes and which has established its tax exempt status under 26 USCA §501(c)(3), or corresponding provisions of any subsequent federal tax laws.

Article XI

Amendments to these articles of incorporation may be proposed by a resolution adopted by the board of directors and presented to a quorum of members for their vote. Amendments may be adopted by a vote of at least two-thirds of a quorum of then directors of the corporation.

I, the undersigned, being the incorporator of this corporation, for the purpose of forming this not for profit charitable corporation under the laws of Florida, have executed these articles of incorporation on this 18th day of December, 2000.
