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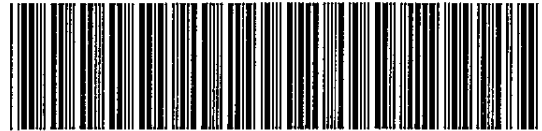

**ARTICLES OF AMENDMENT  
to  
ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION  
of  
AMERICA'S WORKING CLASS FOUNDATION, INC.**

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Pursuant to the provisions of section 617.1006, Florida Statutes, the undersigned Florida nonprofit corporation adopts the following articles of amendment to its articles of incorporation.

**FIRST:** Amendments adopted:

**Article III – Restated and amended**

The purpose of this foundation is to form a Christian based day labor service to bring a better quality of life to the day labor population with better pay and coordinating other community help programs for these people.

The corporation is organized exclusively for charitable, educational, religious, or scientific purposes within the meaning of section 501 (c) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code.

**SECOND:** Amendments added:

**Article VIII**

**Inurement of income:** No part of the net earnings of the corporation shall inure to the benefit of, or be distributable to, its members, trustees, officers or other private persons except that the corporation shall be authorized and empowered to pay reasonable compensation for services rendered.

**Article IX**

**Legislative or political activities:** No substantial part of the activities of the corporation shall be the carrying on of propaganda or otherwise attempting to influence legislation and the corporation shall not participate in or intervene. (Including the publishing or distribution of statements for any political campaign on behalf of any candidate for public office.)

**Article X**


**Operational Limitations:** Notwithstanding any other provisions of these articles, the corporation shall not carry on any other activities not permitted to be carried on a (a) by a corporation exempt from Federal Income Tax under section 501 (c) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 (or the corresponding provision of any future United States Internal Revenue Law) or (b) by a corporation, contributions, to which are deductible under section 170 (c) (2) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 (or the corresponding provision of any future United States Internal Revenue Law.)

**Article XI**

**Dissolution Clause:** Upon the dissolution of the corporation, the Board of trustees shall, after paying or making provisions for the payment of all the liabilities of the corporation, dispose of all the assets of the corporation exclusively for the purposes of the corporation in such manner, or to such organization or organizations organized and operated exclusively for charitable, educational, religious, or scientific purposes as shall at the time qualify as an exempt organization or organizations under section 501 (c) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 (or the corresponding provision of any future United States Internal Revenue Law), as the Board of Trustees shall determine, Any such assets not so disposed of shall be disposed of by the Court of Competent Jurisdiction of the county in which the principal office of the corporation is then located, exclusively for such, purposes or to such organization or organizations, as said court shall determine, which are organized operated exclusively for such purposes.

**THIRD:** The date of adoption of the restated, amended and added amendments was April 18<sup>th</sup>, 2003.

**FOURTH:** The President <sup>/sole Director/sole member</sup> adopted the restated, amended and added amendments. The officers and directors will add their support and formally adopt the Articles of Incorporation and bylaws during the first year of operation.
