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ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

OF

NEHEMIAH CDC OF TAMPA HOUSING, INC.

The undersigned, acting as the incorporator of Nehemiah CDC of Tampa Housing, Inc., under Chapter 617, Florida Statutes, submits the following Articles of Incorporation.

ARTICLE I. NAME

The name of the Corporation is:

Nehemiah CDC of Tampa Housing, Inc.

ARTICLE II. DURATION AND COMMENCEMENT

The Corporation will exist perpetually, commencing on the date of filing of these Articles of Incorporation.

ARTICLE III. PURPOSE

The Corporation is organized exclusively for the benefit of, to perform the functions of, or to carry out the purposes of each of its members, including, without limitation, to own real property in furtherance each such member's charitable, educational, literary, or scientific purposes.

No part of the net earnings of the Corporation shall inure to the benefit of, or be distributable to the members, directors, officers, or other private persons, unless the members, director, officer or other private person is itself an organization qualifying for exemption from federal income tax as an organization described by Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, or the corresponding section of any future United States Internal Revenue Law and except as reasonable compensation for services rendered or to make payments and distributions in furtherance of the purposes set forth in this Article III.

No substantial part of the activities of the Corporation shall be the carrying on of propaganda, or otherwise attempting to influence legislation (except to the extent permitted pursuant to an election made under Section 501(h) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986), and the Corporation shall not participate in, or intervene in (including the publishing or distribution of statements) any political campaign on behalf of, or in opposition to, any other provision of these Articles, the Corporation shall not carry on any activities not permitted to be carried on (a) by a corporation exempt from federal income tax under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, or corresponding

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section of any future United States Internal Revenue Law, or (b) by a corporation, contributions to which are deductible under Section 170(c)(2) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, or corresponding section of any future United States Internal Revenue Law.

ARTICLE IV. MEMBERS

The qualification for members and the manner of their admission will be as provided in the bylaws. The rights exercisable by the members will also be as provided in the bylaws.

ARTICLE V. INITIAL REGISTERED OFFICE AND AGENT

The Corporation designates 1920 E. Hillsborough Avenue, Tampa, Florida 38610 as the street address of the initial registered office of the Corporation and names Chloe Coney the Corporation's initial registered agent at that address to accept service of process within this state.

ARTICLE VI. ADDRESS

The Corporation reserves the right to amend, alter, change, or repeal any provision in these Articles of Incorporation in the manner prescribed by law.
