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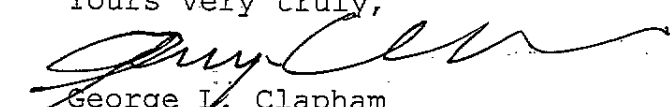

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CHARTER OF  
CONWAY GARDEN CLUB  
A Corporation not for profit.

I.

The name of this corporation shall be CONWAY GARDEN CLUB, with its location at Conway, Florida.

II.

The general nature or the object of the Corporation shall be to stimulate a knowledge and a love of gardening, to aid in the protection of native plants and birds, and to encourage civic planting.

III.

MEMBERSHIP.

Section 1. Membership shall be open to those who live in Conway and vicinity for more than three months of the year.

Section 2. Membership in the Garden Club shall consist of four classes: Active, Associate, Honorary and Courtesy.

Section 3. To be eligible for active membership, a member must do a substantial amount of gardening, or be willing to take an active part in the Club.

Section 4. Associate members shall enjoy the privilege of the Club without responsibility for its work, shall be elected through the regular process for membership, but may not vote or hold office.

Section 5. Honorary Members are those, who, recommended by the Executive Board, may be unanimously elected at any Annual Meeting. They shall be entitled to all the Club privileges (except holding office) and shall be exempt from annual dues.

Section 6. Upon approval of this Charter the Officers of the Conway Garden Club shall request the Secretary of the Club to certify to the Officers the names and addresses of all persons who are at the present time members of the Association known as Conway Garden Club, and who are members of such Association in good standing. All such members so certified shall immediately become members of this Corporation. Except as stated in this Section the membership and the manner of admission shall hereinafter be governed by Sections 1 through 5 above.

## IV.

This Corporation shall have perpetual existence unless sooner dissolved by the membership or by operation of law.

## V.

The business of the Corporation shall be managed, controlled and conducted by a President, First Vice-President, Second Vice-President, Secretary, Corresponding Secretary and Treasurer. Said Officers shall be elected at the regular meeting held on the second Friday of April each year.

The Officers who are to serve from the approval of the Charter until the 9th day of October, 1953 are:

No Officers of the Corporation shall serve more than two years in succession in any one of the above named offices.

Vacancies accruing during the term of office shall be filled by the Executive Board hereinafter provided for, except the office of President, which shall be filled by the Vice Presidents in the order of their office.

VIII.

There shall be an Executive Board which shall consist of the Officers of the Corporation, the Circle Chairman and the Chairman of the outstanding committees and a parliamentarian to be appointed by the President.

IX.

The Annual Meeting of the Corporation shall be second Friday of April of each year, the hour and place to be determined by the Executive Board.

X.

The By-Laws of this Corporation are to be made, altered and rescinded at any regular meeting of the Corporation by a two-third vote of the members present and voting. Prior to any meeting at which any amendment to the By-Laws shall be proposed four weeks notice thereof prior to said meeting must be given.

XI.

The highest amount of indebtedness or liability to which the Corporation may at any time subject itself shall be Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000.00). The value of the real estate which the Corporation may hold shall be unlimited, subject however to the approval of the Circuit Judge.
