ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

for

PRONICA, INC.

ARTICLE I: NAME

The name of the corporation shall be

ProNica, Inc.

ARTICLE II: PRINCIPAL PLACE OF BUSINESS AND MAILING ADDRESS

The principal place of business and mailing address of this corporation shall be:

ARTICLE III: PURPOSES

ProNica, Inc., is incorporated exclusively for religious, educational or charitable purposes within the meaning of Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code and any corresponding provision of a future Internal Revenue Code. A more specific description of the nature and purposes of ProNica, Inc., follows:

Background:

ProNica has been a committee of the Southeastern Yearly Meeting of the Religious Society of Friends (Quakers) for over 10 years. The ProNica committee provides practical opportunities for religious service to promote Quaker testimonies such as peace, equality and community. ProNica will remain under the spiritual care of Southeastern Yearly Meeting.

Purposes:

The purposes of ProNica, Inc. are:

- 1. To provide funds, equipment and information to established community organizations in Nicaragua. The focus of this assistance is on community and economic development, sustainable agriculture, health, education, training in non-violent resolution of conflicts, and women's empowerment.
- 2. To educate North Americans about the history, current conditions and needs of Nicaragua and its people.
- 3. To develop friendships and a sense of partnership with the members of the community organizations we assist.

ARTICLE IV: SELECTION OF BOARD OF DIRECTORS

A majority of the directors of ProNica, Inc., shall be members of the Religious Society of Friends. Southeastern Yearly Meeting of the Religious Society of Friends shall name (appoint) a majority of the members of the board of directors of ProNica, Inc. The remaining members of the board of directors shall be named (appointed) as provided in the bylaws.

ARTICLE VIII: LIMITATION OF CORPORATE POWERS

The corporate powers of this corporation are as provided in 617.0302, Fla Stats. (2000), except:

- (1) That no part of the net earnings of the corporation shall inure to the benefit of any member, trustee, officer of the corporation, or for any private individual (except that reasonable compensation may be paid for services rendered to or for the corporation affecting one or more of its purposes), and no member, trustee, officer of the corporation or any private individual shall be entitled to share in the distribution of any corporate assets on dissolution of the corporation. No substantial part of the activities of the corporation shall be the carrying on of propaganda, or otherwise attempting to influence legislation, and the corporation shall not participate in, or intervene in (including the publication or distribution of statements) any political campaign on behalf of any candidate for public office;
- (2) That it may receive and maintain a fund or funds of real or personal property, or both, and, subject to the restrictions and limitations hereinafter set forth, to use and apply the whole or any part of any income therefrom or principal thereof exclusively for charitable, religious or educational purposes, either directly or by contributions to organizations that qualify as exempt organizations under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code and its regulations as they now exist or as they may hereafter be amended:

- (3) Notwithstanding any other provisions of these articles, the corporation shall not conduct or carry on any activities not permitted to be conducted or carried on (a) by a corporation exempt under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code and its regulations as they now exist or as they may hereafter be amended, or (b) by a corporation contributions to which are deductible under Section 170(c)(2) of such code and regulations as they now exist or as they may hereafter be amended.
- (4) The assets of this corporation are irrevocably and permanently dedicated to the purposes described in Article III. Upon the dissolution of the corporation or the winding up of its affairs, the assets of the corporation shall be distributed exclusively for one or more exempt purposes within the meaning of Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code and its regulations as they now exist or as they may hereafter be amended. Any such assets not so disposed of shall be disposed of by a court of competent jurisdiction of the county in which the principal office of the corporation is then located, exclusively for such purposes or to such organizations as such corporation shall determine, that are organized and operated exclusively for such purposes.

ARTICLE IX: EFFECTIVE DATE OF INCORPORATION

The effective date of incorporation for ProNica, Inc. shall be May 31, 2002.
